# Pastoral Reflections-Go!

#### And God said to them, Go..."

One of the things that you might not know about me is that I ran track back in the day. Okay, it wasn't for many days (only when I was 13 years old) and I was more often than not the last one across the finish line. While I was never bound for the Olympics, it did provide me a model for life.

#### On your mark...

The first thing that runners do is to "get on their mark" by getting into their lane and focusing on the path ahead of them. As people of God, a mark is placed upon our brows at baptism. This mark reminds us that we are claimed as God's beloved, given grace from Jesus and gifted by the Holy Spirit. We are called to look at this mark, using it as a focus for what lay ahead of us in our daily lives.

#### Get set...

Runners prepare themselves for the start of the race as they get set, placing their fingers on the starting line and focusing the energy of their bodies in that ready stance. As Christians, we prepare ourselves through our time together as a community of faith. As we worship together, as we gather in times of faith formation, as we lift one another up in prayer, as we meet one another at the table – we are getting set for living as God's people in the world. We need the gift of community for support, mutual faithfilled conversations, and fellowship. This enables us to get set for life.

#### GO....

Runners do not stay at the starting line just as we do not stay in one place. God called Abram to "Go...to the place that I will show you" (Genesis 12:1) and Jesus called his disciples to "Go, therefore into all nations..." (Matthew 28:19). We go out into the world with the mark upon our brows and the support of the community of faith. We go, taking with us the assurances of God's love for us and for all people, God's presence to accompany us and the call to bring what we have received into the lives of others.

Get on your mark.....Get set

And GO in peace to love and serve the Lord!














#### Off the Shelf Learning to Walk in the Dark by Barbara Brown Taylor

Since an early age, many have thought of the dark as scary, as something to be avoided. In Taylor's book, she explores through her own experiences of dark times, physically, emotionally and metaphysically. She writes: *"I have learned things in the dark that I could never have learned in the light, things that have saved my life over and over again, so that there is really only one logical conclusion. I need darkness as much as I need light."* 

Her personal reflections invite us into our own times of darkness to find what God can reveal in its midst. She quotes this passage from Isaiah to begin her book: "I will give you the treasures of darkness and riches hidden in secret places, so that you may know that it is I, the LORD, the God of Israel, who call you by your name." (Isaiah 45: 3)
