Pastoral Reflections-Community of Thanks

P.R.A.Y. Programs Coming January 2015

The family is where a child's faith often begins and is developed. At Trinity we use the P.R.A.Y. Program (Programs of Religious Activities with Youth) www.praypub.com as an opportunity for parents to study together.

This year we are offering two of the P.R.A.Y. Programs—God and Me for grades 1, 2 and 3 with Irene Germain as counselor and the God and Family Program for grades 4 and 5 with John Bertone as counselor. The programs will be on Sundays in January and February at 10:30 (right after Sunday school)

These programs are run as a "parent and child" program with both the parent and child attending the sessions together. There will be assignments to be done together at home. Originally this program was offered by the church to Girl Scouts and Boy scouts but is now available to all children. A religious award is presented at the end of the program which may be worn on the Girl Scout and Boy Scout uniform.

GENERAL ACCOUNT LOAN—It was necessary to take an additional \$5,000 loan from the Mission Endowment Fund money to keep the checking account from going negative during September.

GENERAL ACCOUNT INCOME—Total income is \$5,571 more than projections. **GENERAL ACCOUNT EXPENSES**—Total expenses are \$3,680 less than projected.

MORTGAGE FUND—Contributions are \$3,436.27 behind through September. **TARGETED BUDGET**—In order to achieve the desired benevolence and custodial care, Trinity needs \$3,956 per week. As of the end of September, we need \$5,138 per week, or \$1,181 more than the normal weekly contribution.

Memorial Gifts—A Christian memorial gift is a contribution of money or property to some Christian cause in loving memory of a relative or friend. We give such memorial gifts on the occasion of a loved one's being called to Eternity, on an anniversary of the "Gift of Life," or on the remembrance or celebration of an event in the life of the departed one. Such gifts, given lovingly, honor the Living Lord, Jesus Christ. If you would like to contribute a monetary memorial gift to Trinity, there are forms available on the credenza in the Narthex.
