Pastoral Reflections-For Such a Time as This

There never seems to be enough time. We are always running out of time. We are all given the same amount of time–12 months, 365 days, 7 days a week, 24 hours in a day. Yet, why does it feel like it is just rushing by?

For such a time as this

Time only speeds up for us as adults as we move towards Christmas (though it slows down for children). We count the days by how many "shopping days" left until Christmas. We cross off the days on the calendar until we gather with family and friends. We make our plans and our preparations for all the celebrations that will mark this month.

For such a time as this

With all of our doing-planning, preparations-what is "such a time as this?"

These are the words that are spoken to Esther by her uncle (our reading for Dec. 7th). Though she did not realize it, God has brought her to this time in her life and will work through her for the good of all. (If you haven't read the book of Esther, take the opportunity; it is short). For such a time as this, for that time in her life, God has prepared her and will lead her to be the hope of a nation.

For such a time as this

In the midst of the frantic nature of this month, we too are prepared for such a time. While we remember the past, marking the birth of Christ, we come to see that the Word-becoming-flesh is happening to today. God is birthed through us and we are called to reveal to the world that God is among us—that there is hope, that all are loved, that peace is possible, that restoration and renewal will happen, that all is not lost.

For such a time as this

It is for this time that Christ was born. It is for this time that God's love is made flesh. It is for this time that hope is restored. It is for this time that peace is promised. It is for this time that we too are prepared.

As you do your planning and preparations, be aware of the time—not as a shrinking clock—but as THIS TIME that God is in our midst and that it is AT THIS TIME that we are called to birth Christ into the world.

Advent Vespers Saturday, December 13, 2014, 5:00 pm

This December's Vespers features Cantatas and organ works by Tunder as well as music by his contemporaries, Buxtehude and Alessandro Stradella. We will have musical offerings by Trinity Brass, Senior Choir, Bell Choir, and organ. Come help celebrate the coming of the Christ Child.

Lutheran Advent Vespers is the invention of organist and composer Franz Tunder (1614-1667) whose quadricentennial we celebrate this year. He was the organist of the Marienkirche in Luebeck, Germany and father-in-law of Didrik Buxtehude. He began the tradition of "Abendmusiken," a long series of free concerts in the Marienkirche, the most elaborate of which were before Christmas time. The earliest of these concerts occurred in 1646. The concerts seem to have originated as organ performances specifically for the businessmen who congregated at the weekly opening of the town's stock exchange. These concerts were to continue through the 17th and 18th centuries; they were distinguished from other concerts by having free admission (for they took place in a church), and by being financed by the business community.

Longest Night/ Blue Christmas Service

For many of us Christmas can be a difficult time. While all the decorations and activities around us call out "be happy and celebrate," we may be feeling sad, aching with the emptiness of having lost a loved one, facing the breakup of a marriage, dealing with financial pressures or the loss of a job, struggling with illness in ourselves or someone close to us, or feeling lonely away from family or friends. We may just be overwhelmed by the hustle and bustle of the world. There are many reasons why we may be feeling "blue."

On Sunday, December 21, at 5:00 PM we will have a special worship service that acknowledges that not everyone feels jolly at Christmas time. Called Worship on the Longest Night or sometimes a Blue **Christmas Service,** this quiet time for worship provides an opportunity to remember our loved ones or share our hurting places with God, and gives us a time to prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ. It is held near the day that has the least daylight and the longest night of the year, calling to mind the darkness that we feel in our lives when we grieve. It also provides the reassurance we need that, even in our longest night, God's love surrounds us. Come and share in this time of worship and supportive fellowship.

We thank Ralph Rudolph, Dawe Morello, Ken Mongold, and Maureen Sergio for sharing their stewardship reflections during our recent worship services. We are blessed by their faith-filled witness. Below is the reflection from Maureen Sergio for you to ponder as you think about your own understanding and experience of stewarship.



When Dawn Morello approached me and asked me if I would speak, I was inclined to say no. When Pastor asked me... I couldn't say no. I tried to think about what I would say that may encourage and motivate people to fill out their pledge cards, because for the last few years, I have not. All I can do is tell my story.

I have been coming to Trinity Lutheran Church since the late 1990s—thank you, Barbara Nicoletti, for leading me here. My daughters received their first Communion and their confirmation here. They belonged to the children's choir and ran bells and chimes. We went on Midnight Runs, to Youth Quakes in New Jersey, and National Youth Gatherings in San Antonio and New Orleans—all the while growing in faith. In those days I felled out pledge cards.

When the economy took a downslide, things changed for us, as I am sure they did for many of you. We found it hard to meet our monthly bills, and that's when I stopped my pledges, but gave what I could.

Coming to service here at Trinity has always brought me a sense of peace. It's the break in the busy week to quiet my mind and to reflect on my blessings. And singing with the choir and ringing bells brings me so much joy. So what would it be like if Trinity was not here? Just as we have been having trouble paying our bills... so has our church.

I started to think about my spending and where I could make a change. I've been in the habit of stopping at Dunkin' Donuts for an iced coffee almost every day. It easily adds up to \$15 each week. This is now my new pledge, and I'll look for ways to improve upon it. So I'll ask all of you to look for your iced coffee. Maybe it means bringing lunch to work instead of buying, or fewer trips to Peachwave and Carvel.

And ask yourself: What would it be like for you if Trinity was no longer here?


