How is that definition reflected in your experience and participation at Trinity?

We talk about Church being more than the building or place of gathering; though we still talk about "going to church."

When people have shared with me their experiences with Trinity what I hear more often than not is their relationships with others. They speak of particular groups or individuals that have made an impression or an impact on their lives.

In this ever changing world, "church" has become just one more thing in people's lives. It is one group or activity among many others. And often, church is the first thing that gets removed from people's stressful schedules.

What difference does the Church and your understanding of Church mean in your day-to-day life?

This is not a criticism or a guilt trip, but rather the opportunity for us to each reflect on our relationships as a part of Trinity Lutheran Church.

In a time when all churches are struggling as well as closing or joining with others, we are called to a time of reflection and refocus. And the pervading question is what does it mean to be the Church in this day and age? (This question in other forms was asked during the Reformation, the Great Schism as well as in the early church; see writings by Phyllis Tickle or Diana Butler Bass for details).

We can no longer take Church for granted, that we will always be here. We can respond in desperation to maintain the status quo or we can reexamine what it means to be the Church and seek the ways in which God is calling us to live as the Church today.

For as we sing in the familiar hymn, "The Church's one foundation is Jesus Christ her Lord/she is his new creation by water and the word..." (ELW #654) – God continues to create and renew us as the Church for today's world. The Church will not disappear. We are called to reclaim our understanding and faith-filled relationship with God as we gather as God's people to be the Church of today.

I invite you to join with Trinity as we pray for God's vision of a new creation of the Church and how we are called to carry forth this vision into the future.

The Annual Meeting of the congregation is the primary legislative session of our life together. Although it may seem odd to be voting on ministry, we are governed and led by the decision-making that happens at this assembly each year.

There will be **one worship service only at 8:30 AM**. Following worship, our Affirmation students will serve their delicious egg sandwiches, and we will reconvene at 10:30 am for the Annual Meeting.

There will be NO 10:45 worship service on January 25th.

Annual reports will be available to pick up on Sunday, January 18 and at the meeting on January 25. The agenda for the meeting includes the election of Council and Nominating Committee members and approval of the budget for 2015.

Voting members are confirmed members who have communed and made a contribution of record in 2013 or 2014. Beginning on this page of the *Trinitarian* is a list of our current voting membership, to the best of our knowledge. Please speak with council co-presidents Don Icken and Dawn Morello, Pastor Jen, or Amy Finney in the church office if you have any questions about voting membership. Ten percent of our voting membership will constitute a quorum for the meeting. At the time of the writing of this report (December 26, 2014), there are 239 voting members, meaning a quorum of 24 is required. The vote on the budget and election of Council and Nominating Committee members each require a simple majority vote.

Your presence at this meeting is important. Please read the Bulletin of Reports carefully, prepare questions and comments, pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit, and attend ready to fulfill the joys and responsibilities of congregational membership.





GENERAL ACCOUNT EXPENSES—Total expenses are \$436 less than projected.

MORTGAGE FUND—Contributions are \$2683 behind through November.

TARGETED BUDGET—In order to achieve the desired benevolence and custodial care, Trinity needs \$3,956 per week. As of the end of November, we need \$9,483 per week, or \$5,527 more than the normal weekly contribution to make up the deficit.


