- 1. Mouthwash bottles and caps
- 2. Deodorant containers and caps
- 3. Toothpaste tubes and caps
- 4. Soap packaging
- 5. Floss containers
- 6. Toothbrushes
- \*No need to empty or rinse containers

# Ordinary recyclable items such as shampoo bottles, toothpaste tubes, printer cartridges, and cell phones can be turned into cash for Trinity while keeping items out of landfills and the ocean. For more information, contact Georgina Marek.

Any time you use a personal care or beauty product, bring the packaging and deposit it in the appropriate container in the coat closet. Trinity will periodically ship the items to Terracycle to be recycled in return for points that will lead to cash deposits.

# PERSONAL CARE AND BEAUTY accepted waste\*:

- 1. Hair care packaging such as shampoo bottles and caps, conditioner bottles and caps, hair gel tubes and caps, hair spray bottles and triggers, and hair paste plastic jars and caps
- 2. **Skin care packaging** such as lip balm tubes, face soap dispensers and tubes, face lotion bottles, tubes and plastic jars, body wash containers, soap tubes and dispensers, body lotion dispensers and bottles, shaving foam tubes (no cans), and hand lotion bottles and tubes
- 3. **Cosmetics packaging** such as lipstick cases, lip gloss tubes, mascara tubes, eye shadow cases, bronzer cases, foundation packaging and bottles, powder cases, eyeliner cases, eyeliner pencils, eye shadow tubes, concealer tubes, concealer sticks, and lip liner pencils

Please NO chargers or batteries.

Please restore your device to factory settings and/or remove any personal information prior to sending through this Brigade program.

TerraCycle is not responsible for information on your devices.

Hard drives will be removed and shredded. All information from electronics is removed.

#### **INKJET & TONER CARTRIDGE accepted waste:**

Inkjet cartridges—identified by the presence of a copper electronic nozzle strip on the ink cartridge. This copper nozzle strip is unique to inkjet cartridges as it is the means by which the ink is transferred to the paper. All types of inkjet cartridges are accepted.

Toner cartridges—only select toner cartridges are accepted. There is a list posted by the container.

Tanks are ink holders and are NOT accepted through this program. They are identified by the lack of a copper strip.

Or you can go to our blog at: <a href="http://tlcdevotions.blogspot.com/">http://tlcdevotions.blogspot.com/</a> We are using the words from the Lent Photo a day (see below) as our guide. There will also be a variety of Lenten devotionals made available in the church narthex.
- Bible Study: Join one of the Faith formation opportunities: Sunday morning (9:45am); Wednesday evening (7pm) and in March on Thursday mornings (10am) with WELCA (all are invited)
- 4) Lent Madness: learn about a variety of people of faith through this bracket system (see separate handout), voting each (or most) days for your favorite as they move from the round of 32 through the Saintly 16, Elate 8, Faithful 4 to the Golden Halo. Go to www.lentmadness.org for more info
- 5) Lent Photo A Day: Each day has a different word to reflect upon.
  Suggestions are also to take a picture and post to the Facebook page (of same name). We are inviting people to take a day and share their own reflections through our Lenten Devotions.







First of all, the confession – I have not yet fully read either of these books. However, their topics and mutual premise is compelling, particularly for this Season of Lent. Both books reflect on the need to both forgive and to be forgiven. They also are up front about the difficulties inherent in forgiveness. It is not easy nor should it be. Both these books invite us into the journey.

The Book of Forgiving: the Fourfold Path for Healing Ourselves and the World

by Desmond Tutu and Mpho Tutu In conjunction with a website that is called the Forgiveness challenge, we are invited into this journey of faith. They state in the book's introduction that "In our own ways, we are all broken. Out of that brokenness, we hurt others. Forgiveness is the journey we take toward healing the broken parts. It is how we become whole again."

The Sunflower: on the possibilities and limits of forgiveness by Simon Wiesenthal

The author relates the experience of when he was in a Nazi concentration camp of being asked to hear the dying confession of one of the Nazi officers and to offer him absolution for the sins committed against him. He said nothing.

This books offers reflections from others on the question of what would they have done. How might we answer the same question ourselves?

Entries include the Dalai Lama, Abraham Hershcel, Martin Marty as well as 50 others who all offer their own thoughts.
