Pastoral Reflections-Solving Puzzles

I love all kinds of puzzles (and mystery novels). It is fun to try to figure out or find a solution to these kind of "problems." They often give me a sense of accomplishment in an otherwise ambiguous world. Many things in our daily lives are not as easily or as quickly solved. I suspect that there is something in your life right now that seems unsolvable. We name them as our prayers to God, often hoping for a fast solution. Yet they persistent.

We begin April with Holy Week as the disciples watched the impossible take place. One of their own betrays Jesus to the authorities. Another, despite his own previous protests, denies knowing Jesus at all (not just once, but three times). This humble teacher and leader speaks not a word on his own behalf, but gives himself over to death willingly. This would be the end of the story if Jesus were an ordinary man. People would mourn his death and return to their daily lives.

Everyone thought they knew the answer to this problem. YET, Jesus Rose from the Dead! We know not how, but we trust and believe in the power of God's love that surpasses the limiting power of sin and death. No longer is our sin and death the only answer.

Through Christ's resurrection, we are offered hope and new possibilities in our lives of faith – not just in our deaths, but in our lives today as well. The answers that we think we have found may be surpassed by what Christ lifts up for us. What we think has ended may be given new life in a new way. As Jesus reminds us throughout the Gospels – what was lost is found, what was last will be first, what was dead is now alive.

When faced with the puzzles of life, we turn to the One who offers us a new way. We offer our puzzles to God, seeking the discernment of the Holy Spirit to guide and direct us in ways beyond our own answers. We trust and believe in the Risen Christ who solved the mystery of death with the abundance of his love for all of the world.

CHRIST IS RISEN! HE IS RISEN INDEED!

2015 seems to be taking forever to get going. Winter just won't leave and we aren't even a guarter of the way into the year, but one thing is way ahead of schedule. We are already seriously behind in our finances. At the end of last year our income was \$7,000 behind our expenses, and we had to borrow \$10,000 for our shrinking Endowment Fund to cover some of the debt. At the end of this February we are almost \$10,000 behind on the General Fund and \$1,000 on the Mortgage Fund. At the beginning of March we had to move \$5,000 from the Endowment Fund to our checkbook to guarantee we could pay salaries and bills. So please, if you are behind on your pledge, try

Faith @ Home

This is a "new" monthly feature with resources and ideas of ways that you can share your faith at home. If you have additional ideas that you would like to share with others, please send them to Pastor Jen.

Easter story cookies: Here is a way to share the Easter story while making cookies.

- 1 cup whole pecans
- * 1 tsp vinegar
- 3 egg whites
- * a pinch of salt
- 1 cup sugar
- * zipper baggie
- wooden spoon
- * tape (any kind)

Bible

* wax paper

Preheat oven to 300 degrees (this is important, don't wait till you're half done with the recipe!)

Place pecans in zipper baggie and let children beat them with the wooden spoon to break into small pieces. Explain that after Jesus was arrested, He was beaten by the Roman soldiers. **Read John 19:1-3.**

Let each child smell the vinegar. Put 1 tsp vinegar into mixing bowl. Explain that when Jesus was thirsty on the cross, He was given vinegar to drink. **Read John 19:28-30**.

Add egg whites to vinegar. Eggs represent life. Explain that Jesus gave His life to give us life. **Read John 10:10-11.**

Sprinkle a little salt into each child's hand. Let them taste it and brush the rest into the bowl. Explain that this represents the salty tears shed by Jesus' followers, and the bitterness of our own sin. **Read Luke 23:27.**

So far, the ingredients are not very appetizing. Add 1 cup sugar. Explain that the sweetest part of the story is that Jesus died because He loves us. He wants us to know and belong to Him. Read Psalm 34:8 and John 3:16.

Beat with a mixer on high speed for 12 to 15 minutes until stiff peaks are formed. Explain that the color white represents the purity in God's eyes of those whose sins have been cleansed by Jesus. **Read Isaiah 1:18 and John 3:1-3.**

Fold in broken nuts. Drop by teaspoons onto wax paper covered cookie sheet. Explain that each mound represents the rocky tomb where Jesus' body was laid. **Read Matthew 27:57-60.**

Put the cookie sheet in the oven, close the door and turn the oven OFF. Give each child a piece of tape and seal the oven door. Explain that Jesus' tomb was sealed. **Read Matthew 27:65-66.**

GO TO BED! Explain that they may feel sad to leave the cookies in the oven overnight. Jesus' followers were in despair when the tomb was sealed. **Read John 16:20 and 22.**

On Easter morning, open the oven and give everyone a cookie. Notice the cracked surface and take a bite. The cookies are hollow! On the first Easter, Jesus' followers were amazed to find the tomb open and empty. **Read Matthew 28:1-9.**
