Pastoral Reflections

*"Out of the depths I cry to you, O Lord.
Lord, hear my voice..." (Psalm 130:1)*

As I sit down to write July's pastoral reflections, I have sitting next to my computer pictures of the nine victims of the shooting at Mother Emanuel church in Charleston: Cynthia Hurd, Rev. Clementa Pickney, Rev. Sharonda Coleman-Singleton, Daniel Simmons, Rev. Depayne Middleton, Tywanza Sanders, Myra Thompson, Ethel Lee Lance, and Susie Jackson. Only five days have passed since this horrific crime was perpetuated by hate and racism.

I am keeping their pictures there as I give thanks for their faith-filled lives and offer up prayers of comfort for their families, fellow church members, and the people of Charleston. But more than a touchstone of prayer, their pictures remind me of my own disconnectedness to the racism that people of color face every day.

Racism is more than the overt actions of white supremacists; it is more than a confederate flag or a seat on a bus. It is in the underlying ways that myself as a white person is viewed over and apart from my sisters and brothers of color.

*"If you, O Lord should mark iniquities,
Lord, who could stand?" (Psalm 130:3)*

What are my immediate reactions when I see an African-American man or woman? How do I treat or approach them differently than I would someone who is white? While I may not *feel* privileged, am I just because I am white?

I am convicted by my complacency. I am reminded that in my complacency that there are others for whom assumptions are made that are much more harmful than the "blondes are dumb" or "women can't be pastors."

This is the challenge and the call for me as a person of faith – to look beyond myself and see all God's people as created in the beautiful image of God. And then more than looking, to join my voice with others to proclaim this as well with my whole life. For you see...

*"I wait for the Lord, my soul waits,
And in his word I hope..."*

*For with the Lord there is steadfast love,
And with him is great power to redeem."
(Psalm 130:5,7)*

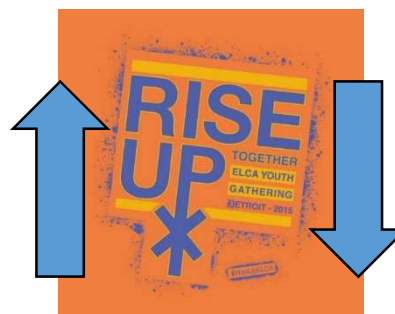




YOUTH GROUP

Stewardship

How does your garden grow?

Many of the things that were planted this spring have taken root and are growing. Some may even be partaking of the first fruits of their garden (or the local farmers' market). It is great to watch the earth continue to bring forth life in all its abundance. And while we can't make these plants grow any faster, there are things that we can do to provide for the best environment for growth such as weeding, watering, and feeding.

As we look at all of God's good creation, we can see the ways in which the seeds of faith planted within each of us also needs weeding, watering, and feeding. How do we care for the faith that has been entrusted to us?

Weeding: What crowds out your faith? Is it busyness? Worry? Confusion? Anger? Doubt? Or something else?

In naming our own answers to these questions, they become our confession. As we confess those things that inhibit our faith, we lift them before God, seeking the ways in which Christ helps us move toward removing them so that our faith may blossom more.

Watering: What is your faith thirsting for? Hope? Forgiveness? Love? Acceptance? Purpose?

In Christ, we are offered the living water that sustains our faith. We remember that this gift of life comes from God and that God offers us the fullness of that life to celebrate and live daily. We come together in worship and fellowship to offer this sustaining flood of grace from God to one another.

Feeding: What is your greatest hope for your life and the world around you? What brings you purpose and meaning and sustenance?

Christ as the Word of God became flesh among us to offer us the best that God has to give. This Word points us to the gift of one another. As we join in prayer, reflection, and conversation with one another, we help to feed each other's faith with God's love and grace.

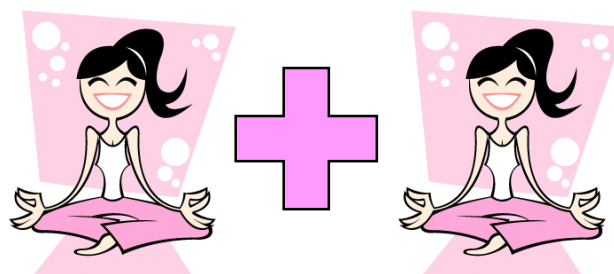

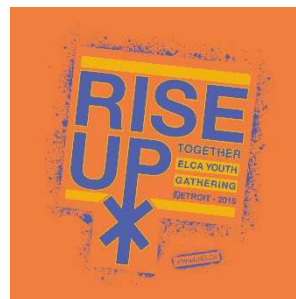
