Pastoral Reflections—Faith



If you were to name the top three people in your life who have been important to your own growth in faith – who would they be?

Who would you have named from your younger years?

While many of us have had significant Sunday school teachers, youth leaders, and/or pastors who would make this list, studies have shown that parents are the primary conveyers of faith (see the National Study of Youth and Religion for more specific information).

In the Bible, we read: *“Keep these words that I am commanding you today in your heart. Recite them to your children and talk about them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise.”* Martin Luther wrote the Small Catechism with this in mind for parents to use with their children at home.

At Baptism, parents and godparents are entrusted with their child’s faith and promise to *live with them among God’s faithful people, bring them to the word of God and the holy supper, teach them the Lord’s Prayer, the Creeds and the Ten Commandments, place in their hands the holy scriptures, and nurture them in faith and prayer, so that your children may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world that God made, and work for justice and peace.* The congregation takes responsibility for these promises as well as we vow to support and prayer for them in their life in Christ.

Over the years, the church has become the primary conveyer of faith. Seen in the same light as schools, the church has been the place where faith has been taught and shared. In and of itself, there is nothing wrong with this role of the church, though it should not and cannot be the primary and/or sole place of faith formation. Remember, the main examples of faith are parents.

Where the church has fallen short is in not fulfilling its own part of the baptismal promises in terms of support of families. In a time when more and more people do not have a direct association with a church, when faith is no longer a given, and the largest growing segment of the religious population is the “nones,” the church has continued its business as usual, assuming that we are still living in a previous age. We ask parents to take responsibility for their child’s faith development, but then do not offer them the support and any guidance that they might need.

We are trying to change that. The Adult Faith formation classes (Sundays & Wednesdays) are one part of this. The weekly bulletin insert, *Sharing God’s Story @ Home*, offers resources connected with the Sunday scripture readings to use. Each month, we have started a *Faith @ Home* newsletter article (see page 3) that offers ideas. This will be expanded to a table in the narthex and on our Facebook page, which will have additional resources for you to use. Also, you are invited to check out resources that are available in our library.

What are other ways that we can support you in sharing your faith in your family? What are ideas that you have that you would like to share with others?

Faith @ Home



One of the stories I remember my father sharing with us as we were growing up was called “I am Lovable and Capable” (by Sidney Simon). It is a short allegory that follows a young boy throughout his day as everything that could go wrong does go wrong; where he is faced with an onslaught of criticism to the point that he no longer feels lovable nor capable.

I would suspect that we have all had days like that—the ones where we just want to go back to bed and start again.

It is these kinds of days when we need something like a “Bad Day Jar.” This idea, gleaned and expanded from the website Vibrant Faith @ Home, invites us to pick a Bible verse from a jar on those days as words of hope and encouragement. The verses can remind us that it is God who created us and thus we are lovable and capable. We can share these verses with others to help them to know as well that they are created in the image of God.

We can also make a “Good Day Jar” with verses of praise and thanksgiving for those good days or maybe just a ho-hum day.

To get you started, there are sets of verses available on the Faith @ Home table in the narthex to pick up and use at home. Or you can email Pastor Jen and she can send you the document to print yourself.

Stewardship

I have a pair of earrings that have a small mustard seed in each of them. They recall Jesus’ parable of the mustard seed (Matthew 13:31-32) that we heard in worship the last week of August. The parable tells us that this smallest of all seeds will grow into a tree that will provide a place for birds to nest. Jesus lifts up that what seems insignificant can yield beyond our imaginations.

Sometimes when we think of our own gifts (time, talents, and treasures), we think that they too don’t make much of a difference; that they are insignificant. Yet, it is these gifts that make up the kingdom (or garden, continuing our theme) of God. Paul talks about the importance of each member of the body (I Corinthians 12:14-26) and that the body is incomplete without each part contributing to the whole.

What you have to share to the mission and ministry of Christ is important. It is vital to being the church together in today’s world.

What are the mustard seeds of your faith? How is God calling you to share of your gifts?


FLAT JESUS UPDATE


