Pastoral Reflections-Faith @ Work

When you think about God, faith, or religion, does a particular place come to mind? When we use the word "church," we do often think about our church building – we **go** to church. In many places, people's faith is so tied to a building that they cannot imagine being the church without having that place to go to where they attend worship, participate in bible studies, attend meetings, and the like.

Theoretically, we know that We Are the Church—that church is not a building or a place. We are the Church as we go out into the world, as we are sent forth from worship into our day to day lives.

But is your job, your school, your home, the dance studio, soccer field... are they Church too?

If we begin to expand our understanding of church even beyond "where two or three are gathered in my name, there I am in the midst of them" (Matthew 18:20) then we can see all the places and ways that God is working in our midst. Church can be a verb as well as a noun. Church is when and where God is found. Not a place, but the way in which God is on the loose in the world.

God works in, through, and around us every day. God is with us wherever we are, whomever we are with, and whatever we are experiencing. God is offering hope, love, and compassion in big and small ways. In the midst of the brokenness and hurting of this world, God is healing and bringing help to all people.

As a pastor, I don't always have the same opportunities as you to experience God's movement in many of the places and times that you find yourself. You are out in the world being the Church in profound ways. I would like to be invited into your lives—be it your work, school, or home—to see what God is up to in your life. If you are willing for me to visit with you, please let me know. If you have questions about how this might work, give me a call. Think of it as a kind of "bring your pastor to work" experience.

Faith @ Home

- What is your favorite part of God's creation?
- What is the most unusual or even strange animal or thing that God has created?

On Sunday, September 13th, I gave the children Fimo clay to use God's gift of creativity given to us to make their own creation. After creating it (and baking it), they were invited to bring it back and share with us. Extra packets of clay are on the **Faith @ Home** table in the narthex.

Use this as an activity at home, reading parts of chapters 1 & 2 in Genesis. Talk about all the different things that God has created. Think about places or things in God's creation that are broken, hurting, or in need of help or repair.

Say a prayer of thanks to God for all that God has created. Pray a prayer of help for all those places where God's creation is suffering or in need of help.

Narrative Lectionary

Over the past few years, we have used a different cycle of readings for our Sunday morning worship. It is called the Narrative lectionary, which highlights the overarching biblical story with a concentration in one of the four Gospels (this year, we have readings from the Gospel of Mark). Each month, we will include the readings for the month if you want to look ahead or catch up if you have missed any (I've included September's readings in case you missed those).

Stewardship—Harvests



Fall is the season of the final harvests for the year. We watch the final growth spurts of squash, pumpkins, and gourds. As the air gets cooler and the seasons change, we are mindful of all the different kinds of "harvests" in our lives. We can think of the various milestones that we encounter as harvests, such as: children going to school, a new job, home or relationship, retirement, and the like.

As we move past these milestones, as we experience a new kind of harvest, we find that we develop new gifts, abilities, and insights about ourselves and the world around us.

Reflect on examples from your own life—what changed in your understandings and perspectives when you experienced a new milestone?

For example: when you learned to drive a car-

How did your awareness change when you thought about moving from place to place?

How did your attention grow when you saw other drivers or when your car made an unusual sound?

Our faith and relationship with God yields different "harvests" as we learn, grow, and experience new perspectives.

In the hymn "We Plow the Fields and Scatter" (#681), we sing in the refrain:

"all good gifts around us are sent from heaven above.

We thank you, Lord, we thank you, Lord, for all your love."

In another hymn, "We Are an Offering" (#692), we sing:

all that we have, all that we are, all that we hope to be, we give to you."

We are given a new perspective as we look at our lives and all that we have experienced. When we view our lives as a blessing from God, our understanding of our possessions, our relationships, our time, and abilities can be seen as gifts from God. When we reflect upon these gifts, our desire to use them wisely and faithfully expands. This is a harvest of our faith.

As our conversations about stewardship begin to expand this fall, we pray that our understandings of the gifts that God has given us will bear new fruits. As we look at the fullness of our lives and give thanks for all of our blessings, may we examine the ways in which God calls us to faithfully care for and use these gifts.
