Who was your favorite Sunday school teacher growing up?

What was it about them that made them your favorite?

What do you remember from your Sunday school experience?

Sunday school hasn't changed too much over the years. Yet, across many churches, there has been a steady decline in attendance. There are many different factors that have contributed to this, both things within and apart from our control. Our culture is changing rapidly and many things that the Church has taken for granted – such as regular church and Sunday school participation – is no longer a given in our world. Families are pulled in many different directions with competing responsibilities and obligations. While we may like to reverse these trends, we are still faced with this reality.

Yet, the core and heart of Sunday school and more centrally, our faith remains still very important and vital to our lives. Much of our own Sunday school and faith experiences is based on the relationships we had with specific teachers rather than merely the content of what they taught. We may not remember all that we learned, but we know what it meant to have the commitment of a teacher who wanted to share their faith with us.

Faith is about relationship. It is our relationship with God who has created us and is present with us today. It is our relationships with others where we can experience and share the love of Christ with others. Faith is found as we gather in community. Faith is shared as we work together to share the love of God. Faith is expressed in relationship.

The means by which our faith is learned and shared will be going through a time of transition and change. We don't yet know what this will mean specifically in practical terms. However, we are committed to finding the best ways for children and adults to continue to learn and grow in our faith. We seek to help, inspire and guide each other to live and share our faith daily.

There is a task force that is looking at the challenges that we are facing, the core purpose of faith formation and how we may best enable people in today's world to know, live and share God's love. We thank our task force members for being willing to envision the future; they are: Doris O'Toole, Joanne Icken, Charlie Germain, Albert Cuomo, and Michael Boyd and myself. We have been blessed with the gift of faith. As our faith is formed and shaped, may we live and share God's mission of love in our world.

We will be looking for volunteers who would be willing to host the meals for these gatherings. Watch for a sign-up sheet to reserve which week you are able to do so.



Baby Care Kits

We ask the congregation to help us by donating items to help with the LWR projects. We need used cotton tee shirts to make baby gowns, used clean cotton or cotton/polyester sheets or tablecloths for the back of quilts; and the following items needed for each baby kit:

- + Two lightweight cotton tee shirts (no onesies)
- Two long- or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet)
- Two receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, up to 52 inches square
- + Four cloth diapers, flat fold preferred
- + One jacket, sweater, or sweatshirt with hood, or include a baby cap
- + Two pairs of socks
- + One hand towel (dark colors recommended)
- Two or three bath-size bars of gentle soap equaling 8 to 9 oz. any brand in original wrapping (no mini or hotel-size bars)
- + Two diaper pins or large safety pins

Please bring in any of these item to help us make up the kits.
