Pastoral Reflections-"What's it worth?"

Do you remember the 1970's series called *The Six Million Dollar Man*? After an accident, they rebuilt the character, Steve Austin, with a bionic eye, arm, and legs for a worth of \$6 million dollars (not sure what they would be today).

What are we worth?

According to a couple of online searches, our bodies are worth anywhere from \$4.50 (our chemical composition) to about half a million dollars (black market prices for our organs, etc.).

What are we worth?

In today's culture and world, worth is often determined by many different kind of factors. We place higher worth on celebrity and success. People grow in estimation due to abilities and talents. We will use the phrase that someone is worth "their weight in gold" to highlight their importance in our lives. We give out awards and accolades for achievements.

Is this what determines our worth?

Still there are others who may be dismissed as "not worth our time or effort"; who don't matter in the greater scheme of things. Or who are just overlooked or forgotten. There are those who once they've "served their purpose" in our lives are put aside. We may not blatantly say this, but how often has this been true in our culture?

Paul said to the Corinthians "we regard no one from a human point of view....if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation" (2 Corinthians 5:16-17) Our worth is not based on merit or everchanging standards – our worth is because of who God in Christ is. We are created in the image of God and we are loved so much that Christ would give his whole life for our sakes – not because we earned it, but because of who God is.

What is our worth? We are priceless!

All are priceless – yes, you as you look in the mirror. And yes, that person who is often overlooked by others. And yes, that person who angers you. And yes, that one who thinks and acts differently from your own experience. Yes, those who are gay or straight, male or female, all different shades of color, background, religion, political affiliation, or as Paul said to the Galatians (3:28) "there is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female, for all of you are one in Christ."

People may determine worth because of the categories that they are placed in, but we, as people of God, are to both see and uphold all people as beloved of God – not by human standards, but by the love and grace of God. In this time of polarization and increasing distinctions of worthiness, hold fast to that which calls us beyond these boundaries. Look to Christ as the One who sees us all as worthy of his unconditional love.

A Heartfelt Thank You

Thank you to all the Trinity members and churchgoers who have donated quarters, other change, dollars, and more in the blue containers we have. I especially appreciate Kathie Ruhs asking for donations when I can't be at the service. Over \$130 has been collected and given equally to community members Melissa, Eric, Robert, and Richard for costly bus transport to jobs and appointments. Eric has completed his first week working part-time at a deli (within his Social Security disability guidelines). He has to take a bus six times weekly, which costs \$7.50 round trip. Robert, living in a tiny room with a hotplate, told me to make sure I thanked the church members for him. Thank you for helping me in this outreach! Next, it's oatmeal for the homeless family living in the Budget Inn with three children, as when school ends they lose breakfast and lunch for their children, which they receive at school during the year. Connecticut has legally mandated "feeding stations" to give kids lunch during the summer. They have proven when you lack food, vou lose brain cells.

I feel so blessed to have Trinity family members help me spread God's love and care though our efforts.

Faith@Home

As schedules often change in the summer months, think about ways that you can include faith practices in this time. Here are a few suggestions:

Mealtime prayers – if this isn't something that you already do on a regular basis, take a moment before you eat to give thanks for your meal as well as those who helped to provide it (family, grocery stores, farmers, etc.)

Flat Jesus – don't forget to pick up one of the coloring sheets of Jesus (four different ones this year), color him in, cut him out and include him in your summer activities (take a picture and send it to the church office) **Road trip activities:** Here are a few things that you can do as you travel:




Intergenerational Summer series


