## Pastoral Reflections - 499 Years!

This October 31<sup>st</sup>, marks 499 years since Martin Luther first nailed his 95 theses to the door of the Wittenburg Church. This



German monk was not looking to start a new church (and would probably dislike that we call ourselves "Lutheran"). His "top 95" listing was the naming of the ways that he saw that the Church of his day had lost sight of what was key to being a person of faith. It was an invitation to discussion and debate about the primary aspects of faith.

Nearly 500 years has seen many changes to the Church, not just in the different Christian traditions that were born of the Reformation, but most certainly the world in which the Church finds itself. While all these different expressions of the Christian faith still maintain their own identity, we have found ways to work together over the years. We experience this locally as we work together at the BESP shelter as well as our annual Thanksgiving service.

At this August's ELCA Churchwide Assembly, a document called "Declaration of the Way: Church, Ministry and Eucharist" was adopted. This document lists the 32 points of agreement between the Lutheran church and the Roman Catholic Church. It points to the ways in which we are united rather than what divides us. Reformation Sunday has historically been a day of celebration for Lutherans. We mark our roots and heritage as a church. We lift up our identity as well as our mission. As we moved towards the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary, we seek to not just look to the past but begin to engage in our future. We are called into an ongoing

re-formation of the church. Just as Martin Luther addressed the concerns of his day, we are called as people of God to let our faith inform the concerns of our lives and world today.

While the Church is distinct from the culture, we still live in the midst of the culture. We have much to offer in the way of forgiveness, peace, love and acceptance. We are called to live as if Christ was walking with us each moment of our day. The Reformation was a call to repentance of all those ways that the Church had turned away from God. As we turn back towards God and are forgiven, we live out that grace in all the ways we interact with others in our lives. We look to our common humanity that unites us as God's people – where in the updated words of Paul's letter to the Galatians (3:28) there is no longer Christian nor Muslim, gay nor straight, rich nor poor, white nor a person of color, but we are all one in God.

In a world marked by divisions, we are called to unity as fellow creations of God. We look to the things that unite us rather than divide us. We seek to love as we have been loved, forgive as we have been forgiven, welcome as we have been welcomed. This is the way of re-formation for the Church of today. If we were to write our own 95 statements of re-formation for the world today – what might they include? Let me know what you think.

## Money! A Pastor's Confession

True confession time: I (Pastor Jen) "hate" talking about money. I really don't want to have to deal with it or think about it (I am very thankful for Michael who takes care of most of our financial planning). I don't want to have to worry about it or plan for it or anything.

I am thankful for all those truly gifted people who serve on our Finance committee who love numbers and working with them. We are blessed by their service.

And so as a pastor, I am even more uncomfortable having to bring it up periodically in the church. I will often spend more time thinking and writing about "stewardship" in terms of our time and our talents. I will often say that "stewardship is about more than money" – which is true.

Yet, the reality of both my personal life as well as our life together as a congregation is that it takes money in order for things to happen. If we want to keep warm, we need to pay for oil. If we want to worship together, we need electricity for the lights and organ, wafers and wine for communion, paper for bulletins, and most certainly the gifts and time of our organist, office administrator and myself. Just as paying your own mortgage and rent is a necessity, so too are the expenses that we incur as a church.

What we have found over the years is that when there is a special appeal for a particular project like the new windows in fellowship hall or the floor in Shepherd's hall, the gifts come pouring in without a lot of pushing. We like to be able to see what our gifts can do. It is the less "exciting" things like heat and electricity, snowplowing and salaries that we spend less time thinking about.

Like many other churches in today's world, finances can be a struggle. We have cut back

on just about everything that we can without impeding our ministry any more than we have to. We are good stewards of all that we receive from your offerings. Yet, month to month, we find ourselves dipping into our ever shrinking reserves which at the current rate will be depleted in the next 2-3 years.

Other than robbing a bank or winning the lottery, we are in need of your help in an ongoing basis. If we all work together, offering what we are able to do – we can overcome our deficit. Maybe you can give an additional \$5 a week or maybe a one-time extra gift when you get a bonus or unexpected gift of your own. Maybe rather than only giving when you come for worship, you sign up to give regularly through our on-line giving option (go to our website, <a href="http://trinitybrewsterny.org">http://trinitybrewsterny.org</a>, to find more info).

I am not going to tell you how to spend your money. It is you and your family's decisions about the ways you prioritize and steward the resources that you have. I would invite you to pray about the ways in which you already support the mission and ministry of Trinity and seek to discern the ways in which God may be calling you in new ways.

## **Questions of Faith**

#### **Faith & Science**

This month, I thought I'd talk a bit about the intersection of science and faith. Too often, science is presented as the opposite of faith; that if you belief in science, you can't be a person of faith. This often presents itself in the discussions about evolution and creation. The perception is that you either believe in one or the other.

This particular discussion rests on our understanding of scripture. If we view the Bible literally then we view the creation of the world as a 7 day/24 hour a day reality. And yet, God's time is not our time. God transcends time and space and cannot be contained by the ticking of our clocks. The story of Creation is not so much about recalling an historical event but rather the truth of a God who in all his wonder and majesty wove creation into being in God's time and not our own. We seek to understand God's time through the study of evolution, marveling at the work of God's hands.

As people of faith, we are invited to see that the study of science is a gift and blessing from God. We are given the gift of curiosity and the ability to learn, study and grow in understanding. To neglect this gift is to not live fully into the people that we have been created to be. Science enables us to be good stewards of the whole of God's creation as we seek to learn and discover the wonder of God's creating power.




