Pastoral Reflections - I heard it said

"Something's your vocation if it keeps making more of you" (quote from Gail Godwin's novel: Evensong).

This quote caught my attention while preparing for a sermon a month or so ago. This will often happen to me — I will come across a quote that speaks to where I am in my own life's journey. I have scraps of paper taped to my computer screen and pinned to my bulletin board with many of these quotes. These quotes serve as prayers as well as inspiration for me. Here are a few more of them:

May God's grace go before you. May his love enfold you. May his mighty arms uphold you, protect you til' we meet again, go with God.

Prayer is not about getting God's attention but giving our attention to God.

Use me, God. Show me how to take who I am, who I want to be, and what I can do, and use it for a purpose greater than myself (Martin Luther King, Jr.)

Sometimes – maybe once in a generation – a spirit of resistance is awakened at the intersection of love, faith and holy outrage.

The glory of God is humanity fully alive. (Irenaeus)

Life is a verb. (fortune cookie)

But by the grace of God I am what I am and his grace toward me has not be in vain (I Corinthians 15:10)

These quotes have come to me at different times and in different places. I haven't always written down who said it or where I found it (I need to get better about this), but still they came often when they were the words that I needed to hear at that particular time.

While I only included one scripture reading in the quotes above, there are countless verses that have served as the voice of God spoken when I needed to hear from God. Other examples include:

Be still, and know that I am God. (Psalm 46:10)

For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. (Jeremiah 29:11)

No testing has overtaken you that is not common to everyone. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tested beyond your strength, but with the testing he will also provide the way out so that you may be able to endure it.

(I Corinthians 10:13)

Do you have quotes and/or scripture verses that you turn to at different times in your life? What has inspired you? What has guided you? Given you hope? Peace?

Think about sharing them with me (as well as others). I'd like to use some of these quotes and scripture passages during one of our Sunday morning Intergenerational events.

I will be needing help this year for some of our classes and if you are interested in being a teacher/ co-teacher or a substitute that would be a great help.




