Pastoral Reflections - All are Welcome

"A few years ago, when we celebrated Trinity's 75th anniversary, we used the phrase, "All are Welcome" as our theme for the year. More than a nice saying, it is both an invitation and a call to a way of life.

We live in a time where many do not feel welcome in certain places and communities. Lines have been drawn to separate people into a variety of categories, of who is on which side with which values, beliefs and understandings. We see these very distinct lines every time we turn on the news or go to any social media site.

I am not naïve enough nor idealistic enough to believe that divisions will ever be totally eradicated. They ebb and flow and take on new forms and distinctions as time goes by. For an example of this, click on this link that shows how the borders in Europe changed over the course of 1000 years:

On the other hand, I am not cynical enough to just throw up my hands and sigh that nothing can change.

I pray that I am faith-filled enough with God's welcoming grace that I seek to find ways to break through those things that divide us and see ALL God's people as precious and beloved. As my dad often told me and I have shared with you – "God don't make no junk!".

We may not be able to change others, but we can seek to change how we respond to the differences we encounter. Even those who are "on the other side" of our own beliefs, we can stop to listen and explore where their beliefs are rooted without making our own assumptions

about them. We don't have to agree but just seek to first understand. We can seek to see them as God's beloved.

We can also speak up on behalf of those whose voices are silenced or ignored. We are called to look beyond ourselves and see one another. We are created to be in community and in relationship with all God's people — whether they are sitting next to us or on the other side of the globe. God entrusts us to each other.

And so, as we are faced with all the divisions before us, we are to respond in faith. We are to welcome all people with the grace of Christ. I share with you a couple of verses from the hymn "All Are Welcome" (ELW #641) to serve as that witness and call to faith:

Let us build a house where love can dwell and all can safely live,

A place where saints and children tell how hearts learn to forgive.

Built of hope and dreams and visions, rock of faith and vault of grace;

Here the love of Christ shall end divisions:

All are welcome, all are welcome, all are welcome in this place.

Let us build a house where prophets speak, and words are strong and true,

Where all God's children dare to seek to dream God's reign anew.

Here the cross shall stand as witness and as symbol of God's grace;

Here as one we claim the faith of Jesus:

All are welcome, all are welcome, all are welcome in this place.

Midnight Run

Midnight Run is a volunteer organization dedicated to providing food, clothing, and personal care items to the homeless on the streets of New York City.

A Midnight Run event will be held on **Sunday morning**, **October 1st**. Volunteers are needed to sort clothing, bag toiletries, shop, cook, prepare and package breakfast sandwiches, prepare and package lunches, travel to NYC, and serve the food, clothing, and toiletries. Drivers with cars, vans or trucks are needed to transport the food, clothing and volunteers.

Begin now saving blankets and gently used winter clothing for men and women: hoodies, sweatpants, sweatshirts, sweaters, fleece goods, hats, coats, gloves, pants, long sleeve shirts, and shoes. New underwear and new socks are needed. Also clean backpacks, duffels, and canvas bags are needed for the men to store their belongings in. No suitcases please.

All clothing should be warm as they spend a lot of time outside. It should also be clean and without any tears.

Small sized toiletries such as soap, toothpaste, combs, deodorant, shampoo, and lip balm are needed if you have some at home or can purchase some, please place them in a plastic bag.

Starting September 17th you can bring in your donations and place them in Shepherd's Hall on the left side as you enter the room. If you plan to deliver donations on a Sunday, you must deliver them by 11 AM as the room is used after that time. Do not leave any bags of clothing or toiletries in the library or hallway. In the coming weeks a signup sheet will be made available in the Narthex. Please consider volunteering to help out especially if you have never participated in a Midnight Run. Youth in Grade 7 and up can participate. All 7th and 8th graders require a parent chaperone. This is a Trinity ministry, please help to make it a success.

Commemorative Eucharist and Festive Reception, Wednesday, November 1, 2017

Christians across the globe will commemorate the 50th anniversary of the start of the Protestant Reformation this fall. In the Metropolitan New York Synod, we are looking to the next 500 years and how we will move into a new reformation with faith, not fear.
