Pastoral Reflections – 500 Years and Counting

With the beginning of October, the activities in preparation for the 500th anniversary of the Reformation begin to grow. We have so many different resources for people to learn more about Martin Luther and the history of the Reformation – check out the related articles with some of those ideas.

Reformation 500 is more than a history lesson, however. While it is always good to pause and see where we have been, it is just as important to see where we are going. In looking back, we are afforded the opportunity to remember what was significant about that time and how that might still apply to our present.

Amidst all Luther's writings, we can find that one central passage from Romans 3:24 *"they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus"* that stands as the cornerstone of his own faith. Not by his own doing nor by the sale of forgiveness can God's love be earned. God's love and grace is a pure gift that is given freely to all people.

Luther took this gift to heart – not just for himself, but saw how it might change the lives of others around him. He felt compelled to share this Good News with others through his preaching, teaching and writing. He put it into practice in many ways as well.

We are loved unconditionally by our God – so much so that he sent his Son to not just teach us about that love and mercy, but to show us through his death and resurrection.

So what?

What difference does this make in your, in my, in our daily lives?

How do we respond to this amazing gift?

When someone is in love they want the world to know! When I know that I am loved, it changes how I view myself and the world around me. I want others to experience this same joy.

The Reformation is about how God's love and grace transformed the world of Luther's day; how it impacted the lives of so many. We continue this ministry as we experience this life-changing love for ourselves and seek to bring it to bear upon the lives of others.

The Reformation is 500 years and counting because God's love and grace is not a static event set in time. It is more than a history lesson but a way in which we are called to live our lives daily. It is a call to reform our lives, our church and our world so that we keep Christ as the focus of our work. It is a reminder of the One to whom we belong and who loves us beyond measure.

As Paul writes in Romans 12:2 *"Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God – what is good and acceptable and perfect."*

We are renewed. Transformed. Re-formed by the grace of God.

Faith @ Home

Martin Luther shared the importance of prayer for his own life as well as those in his household. He used these prayers to start and end each day. You are invited to use them as well.

Morning prayer: After arising in the morning, make the sign of the cross and say:

Under the care of God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen.

Then pray: *I give thanks to you, my heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ your dear Son, that you have protected me through the night from all harm and danger and I ask that you would also protect me today from sin and every danger, so that my life and actions may please you. Into your hands I commend myself: my body, my soul, and all that is mine. Let your holy angel be with me, so that the wicked foe may have no power over me. Amen.*

Evening prayer: when you go to bed, make the sign of the cross and say:

Under the care of God the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Then pray: *I give thanks to you, my heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ your dear Son, that you have graciously protected me today, and I ask you to forgive me all my sins, where I have done wrong, and graciously to protect me tonight. For into your hands I commend myself: my body, my soul, and all that is mine. Let your holy angel be with me, so that the wicked foe may have no power over me. Amen.*

Trinity Finances – Bad News, Good News

We use our checkbook to pay all of our bills except for the mortgage and dedicated funds. The BAD NEWS, at the end of August our checkbook balance was \$418, down from over \$17,000 at the start of the year. We have since had to transfer the last \$5,000 out of our Endowment Fund to cover anticipated expenses.

Since we can't cut expenses further without making draconian cuts, such as turning off the lights, not heating the building this coming winter, laying off staff, or going to a part-time pastor, we really need to increase our donations.

The GOOD NEWS, we can do it. Last year we had a very generous increase in giving at the end of the year. I know we can do it again this year. The sooner we start, the more we can raise by giving a little more each week. Please look into your heart and realize how much God's work through Trinity means to each of us, our community and the world, and give generously.

Thanksgiving Baskets for Putnam CAP

Starting November 1st Trinity will be participating in the Thanksgiving Food Basket program for Putnam CAP. The baskets provide a meal to low-income residents of Putnam County. Last year, Putnam CAP distributed over 400 baskets to these struggling families. The Thanksgiving Food Basket can be a cardboard box wrapped with festive paper, a laundry basket, a recyclable shopping bag, a gift bag or any other similar type of container. Putnam CAP asks that the food box contain all of the items needed to make a traditional Thanksgiving Dinner as well as some additional items such as breakfast foods and food for another meal during the week. All food baskets should include a \$15 grocery store gift card for the purchase of a turkey. The completed baskets must be returned to Trinity no later than November 13th.

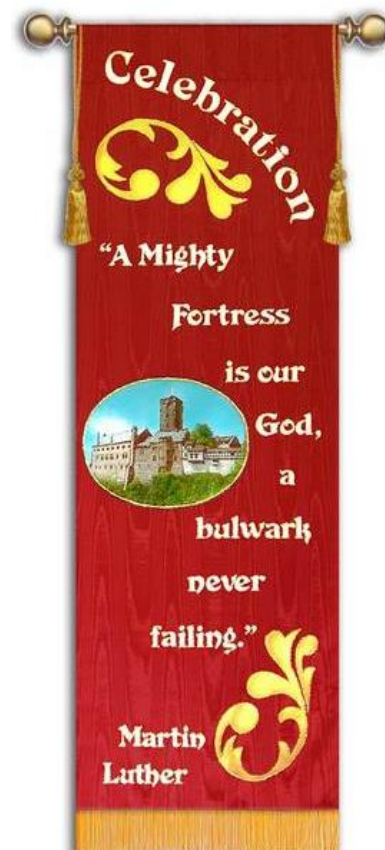
