## Pastoral Reflections – ‘Tis a Season for Singing

Before all the Halloween decorations are down, Christmas songs began to play as the background soundtrack of our everyday lives. Beyond our yearly complaints of the holidays being decorated too early, we do love our Christmas carols. As they are so season specific, we are granted such a short time in which to enjoy them (unless you are a “rebel” and play them year round – you know who are you).

We all have our favorites – from the secular renditions of “Jingle Bells” or “Frosty the snowman” to the sacred carols of “Silent Night” or “Joy to the World” – we all have those particular songs that we can listen to again and again. And we want to start singing them as soon as possible in worship as well.

Just as Christmas carols help us get in the holiday spirit, Advent hymns do the same (even though they may not be as familiar).

- ♪ They speak of the watching and waiting for the coming of the Messiah (#240 “Light One Candle to Watch for Messiah”: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=bJJDJhzClgM> and #254 “Come, Thou Long Expected Jesus” <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=fAGE1Es8IPs> ).
- ♪ They call to mind the brokenness of the world in which Jesus was born as much as they speak of the chaos of today’s world (#256 “Comfort, Comfort Now My People” <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=hONTxzbUMhA> ).
- ♪ They call us out of our complacency and wake up so that we are ready to see God at work in our midst. (#242 “Awake, Awake and Greet the New Morn” <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ckwlojPHqrQ> )
- ♪ They invite us to live daily in hope and promise (#266 “All Earth is Hopeful/Toda la tierra” <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=JCsJjNnmiUA> ).

These Advent hymns are expressions of our faith as we mark the days until Christmas and as we watch and wait to see Christ’s presence in our midst today. While they may not be as familiar as the Christmas carols that fill our ears, they can offer us a different perspective on this season of preparation. They invite us beyond the familiar and comfortable to see God in a new way.

And so let our Advent hymns, as well as the Christmas carols, bring us into a closer relationship with the One who was born in a manger and who is birthed in our midst today. Let these songs be our prayer as we enter into this time of preparation.

The Holiday season is a time of traditions. Here are a couple of additional ideas to incorporate into your own traditions:

**\*Blessing of Christmas Tree:** after your tree is decorated, take a moment to say a prayer such as the following: *God our Creator, we praise you for this Christmas tree, gift of the earth and sign of your evergreen presence. As we illumine this tree, let your blessing come upon us. Send us your Son, the tender branch of Jesse, who brings us light and life. May we who stand in it light eagerly welcome the true Light which never fades, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.*

**\*Blessing of Nativity:** As you put any manger scenes out, use this prayer or your own words to bless it:

*O Lord our God, with Mary and Joseph, angels and shepherds, and the animals in the stable, we gather around your Son born for us. Bless us with your holy presence and inspired us to help*

*those who have no place to dwell. Be with us that we might share Christ's love with all the world, for he is our light and our salvation. Glory in heaven and peace on earth, now and forever. Amen.*

During the Longest Night Service, we offer the opportunity for people to name their sorrow, frustrations and difficulties. We bring them into the presence of Christ to seek healing, strength and peace. This is a powerful service that speaks the true significance of the birth of Jesus.


