Remember the Date

Birthdays, anniversaries, holidays and the like hold special places on our calendars. I have one of those perpetual calendars so I don't have to move all those dates from one calendar to the next with the beginning of each new year, helping me remember those special relationships in my life.

While Christmas is always on December 25th, other holy days in the church calendar move from year to year. Easter moves every year, dramatically so - which makes the beginning of Lent as well as Pentecost move (as they are dependent on Easter's date). The date of Easter is set by determining the first Sunday after the first full moon after the spring equinox which is why it changes every year.

This year, Easter is on April 1st - yes, April fool's day (more about that closer to Easter).


Which makes Ash Wednesday (the 40 days plus Sundays before Easter) fall on Valentine's Day so don't forget to include that in your romantic evening plans.

While our culture has focused on hearts, candy and flowers on February 14th, the significance of this date beginning Lent cannot be lost on us. More than romantic love, the love that we celebrate as Christians is that all encompassing and unconditional love of God. Lent calls us to repentance, turning back to the One who loves beyond measure and without bounds. It calls us back to God as the true source of love and life.

Just as those special dates on our calendars call to mind those significant relationships in our lives, this year – February 14th/Valentine's day calls us back to our first love, the love in whose image we are created, the love that will never leave us, betray or desert us- the love that never ends.

So as we gather on Ash Wednesday and even as we also mark Valentine's Day, we recall the loves in our lives - the love that surpasses all our expectations.

Prayer Mondays

Prayer is central to our lives of faith. It is our ongoing conversation in relationship with God. Over the past couple of years, we had asked people to commit to a day during the month to pray for the mission and ministry of Trinity. We are grateful for all those who faithfully prayed during this time.

For 2018, we are asking people to specifically take time on Mondays for a time of prayer, in addition to whatever is your regular prayer practice. Each week there will be a different focus as well as opportunity for prayer. Some of them will be done in community and others are at home. You are invited to participate in whatever way you feel called.

First Monday: "Pray without Ceasing": In I Thessalonians 5:17, Paul invites the community of faith to pray always. Set your alarm for 5:17 (am or pm, your choice) and pray for the mission and ministry of Trinity.

Second Monday: Prayer Vigil: We will hold a monthly prayer service (7pm) where we will gather in prayer together to pray for specific people, ministries and the like. There will be an opportunity for individual prayer as well as laying on of hands.

Third Monday: Prayer Practices: Different ways of praying will be shared for you to use on your own. They will be posted on Facebook as well as shared in the previous Sunday's bulletin

Fourth Monday: Labyrinth: Our labyrinth will be put out in Shepherds Hall for most of the day for people to stop by and use as they are able (watch for specific times to be posted)

Fifth Monday: As this does not occur every month, this will be the surprise, with ideas or special services announced in the weeks leading up to this particular week.

Third Tuesdays Table Talk

Martin Luther regularly gathered with colleagues, students, friends and others to talk about faith, sharing their thoughts, questions and reflections with one another.

This year's theme is "This Changes Everything." Our primary scripture will be Ephesians 2:8 "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God."

ELCA Youth Gathering Overview

Every three years, 30,000 high school youth and their adult leaders from across the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America gather for a week of faith formation known as the ELCA Youth Gathering. Through days spent in interactive learning, worship, Bible study, service and fellowship, young people grow in faith and are challenged and inspired to live their faith in their daily lives.

An important part of the Gathering's ministry are the two pre-events, the Multicultural Youth Leadership Event (MYLE), a faith formation and leadership development event primarily for youth of color, and the tAble, a gathering that gathers, blesses and empowers youth with disabilities.

Grace is a foundational and distinctive piece of the Lutheran faith. This gift, undeserved and freely given, changes lives and perspectives as people realize they are enough because of what Christ has done and are called into the world to serve their neighbor and share the good news.

Our logo is a visual representation of our theme and the 2018 Gathering experience. It incorporates the coming together of a mosaic to reflect the diverse host city of Houston, as well as the idea that we are a church where *all* are imperfect and incomplete, yet we each belong in – and have an important place in – God's masterpiece. The cross at the center of the logo is the focus – it is God's grace, through Christ's life, death and resurrection, that changes everything for all people.

In her book "Woo: Awakening Teenagers' Desire to Follow in the Way of Jesus," Morgan Schmidt identifies the three central desires of teens. All youth desire:

- Someone to become
- Somewhere to belong
- Something to do [that changes the world]

Throughout the 2015 Gathering and the evaluations and conversations that followed, we heard our young people echo these desires again and again. As young people desire and struggle to find someone to become, somewhere to belong and something to do, the Gathering seeks to be a ministry that helps define some of that or at least open up pathways of discovery. Ultimately, we want youth to understand the fierce love that God has for them, just as they are, and that by grace, through faith, they have been saved. When young people (or really any age person!) truly claim this reality, it indeed changes everything.

To help 50-60 homeless men and women requires many toiletries and underwear. For some it is easier to donate once but for many of us it is easier on the budget to buy a little at a time. We ask that as you shop each week, pick up a couple travel size toiletries such as soap, toothpaste, toothbrushes, combs, deodorant, shampoo, and lip balm. When you are in Walmart pick up new men's underwear sizes M-XL, both briefs and shirts. They have the best price. This will help us make sure we have enough come October.

Please note that the fleece must be new and it cannot have any religious symbols, messages, group names, US flags, patriotic or military symbols or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.
