Walking with Jesus

Our Sunday morning readings are a part of what is called the Narrative Lectionary – this traces God's relationship with us from the Old Testament through the New Testament. It is on a four year cycle with a different Gospel as the focus each of those years. This year, we have been in the Gospel of John.

John has a much different way of bringing us the Gospel message than Matthew, Mark & Luke. There are numerous (and longer) stories in John that we don't find in the others. One of these notable differences is that his account of Holy Week spans almost half of the entire Gospel. Jesus' final meal with his disciples which contains his farewell discourse is five chapters alone!

Unlike other years, we will be hearing the Holy week readings for four weeks during Lent rather than just during Holy Week (this does not include the farewell discourse; though it is included in the daily readings during the week). This gives us the opportunity to do more than just hear Jesus' journey to the cross, but to walk with him.

Scripture does more than teach; it invites us to participate in God's story. It invites us to see the ways in which God enters into our own story, into our daily lives. How have we experienced what Jesus experiences during that week – betrayal, misunderstanding, etc.? Who would we be willing to lay our own lives down for?

When have we needed to hear a word of forgiveness?

We do not experience the depth of what Christ endured, but Jesus knows us deeply as we live amongst sorrow, pain, confusion, violence and despair. Christ is in the midst of our lives – looking at us from the cross as well as from the empty tomb.

We walk the path of Holy week with Jesus. Along this path, we see our God who is faithful in his unconditional love for each of us. We witness a God who does not bow to the transient rulers of this world, but brings a greater truth that surpasses all understanding. We find ourselves drawn into a relationship not based on who we are, but who God was, is and continues to be.

From Jesus kneeling at the feet of his friends to wash their feet (John 13) to his final cry of "it is finished" (John 19:30), we see our God who goes to what might be considered extremes because of his faithful love for all of us. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son so that all who believe in him may not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16)

Let us journey together, growing in faith and understanding of this God who loves each of us.

Prayer Mondays

As we move further into this New Year (and it has lost that "new year smell"), we continue in prayer as a community of faith. We have asked everyone to commit to pray (at the very least) on each Monday of the month. Each week, there is a different way and/or time to pray – join together in this time of conversation with God, in focusing on daily lives in the love and grace of God.

1st Monday (March 5) – We "pray without ceasing" as we set our alarms for 5:17 (am or pm) to pray for our church and our world (based on I Thessalonians 5:17)

2nd **Monday (March 12)** – We gather for a short time of prayer together for a **Prayer Vigil at 7pm**, seeking prayers for healing for ourselves and others.

3rd Monday (March 19) – We learn and use different **prayer practices**. This month, you are invited to look through your wallet, purse or bag – what do each of the items contained there represent and how might they be a prayer (for example: mirror – I am created in the image of God; money – gift from God entrusted to me)

4th Monday (March 26) – This is the beginning of Holy week as we move from Palm Sunday to Easter. This week, we will have the Labyrinth available for people to come and use throughout the day (9am-8pm). Guides will be available to help you use it if you haven't done so before.

Third Tuesdays Table Talk – March 20th

Using a model from Martin Luther who gathered around a meal with family, friends, colleagues and students – we gather for a meal on Tuesday, March 20th (6:30 pm) at **Patrick's Pub, 925 Rte 6, Mahopac** to share a meal and to share our reflections about how our faith impacts our daily lives. In addition to the "5:17" suggestion, you could also pick another time like 3:16 (am or pm) from John 3:16. Find a time that works best for you and/or your whole family.

Easter Candy Bags for Putnam CAP

On Sunday, **March 4th** I will distribute Easter bags after service. If you take a bag please fill it with Easter candy for the clients of Putnam CAP. The filled bags must be returned to Trinity by Monday, March 19th in order for them to be distributed in time for Easter.

Midnight Run

There is a plastic container, labeled "Midnight Run" will be located in the Narthex for donations for our Midnight Run in October. To help 50-60 homeless men and women requires many toiletries and underwear. For some it is easier to donate once but for many of us it is easier on the budget to buy a little at a time. We ask that as you shop each week, pick up a couple travel size toiletries such as soap, toothpaste, toothbrushes, combs, deodorant, shampoo, and lip balm. When you are in Walmart pick up new men's underwear sizes M-XL, both briefs and shirts. They have the best price. This will help us make sure we have enough come October.

Lutheran World Relief Fleece Blankets

On Sunday, April 8th after the first service we will once again assemble Fleece Blankets for LWR. This project requires fleece 58-59" wide by 80" in length. If you have fleece at home and would like to donate it to Trinity, please do so during January and February. Place the fleece in a bag, mark it, bring it to the church and leave it in the Narthex. Please note that the fleece must be new and it cannot have any religious symbols, messages, group names, US flags, patriotic or military symbols or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.
