

Pastoral Reflections – "That's why we gather"

I love to listen to different kinds of music, all depending on my mood at the time. One summer I worked at a record store and probably spent half my pay check on music (cassettes and records; cds were just starting to be produced – so that will tell you how long ago it was!). Over the years, I have been drawn to artists outside of the mainstream who often write their own songs which seem to emanate from their own life experiences.

Recently, one of the artists that I've actually met and been to see a few times, named Christopher Williams, put out a new cd. Many of his songs over the years have had spiritual themes woven into their lyrics. The title track of this cd, "Gather" speaks to the gift of community and the reasons that we do gather together in faith (see the sidebar for the lyrics)

People are not joining in communities as much as they used to – we often live very fragmented lives. Too busy to join, too many other things to do; if we just had more time, we might join. Not only are churches facing a decline in membership, but so too are many of the other communities such as fraternal organizations, the VFW and the like.

In the beginning, we were created and God said that it was not good for us to be alone. The creation of Adam and Eve was about much more than just two people starting a family, but it was about the importance of community.

I need you. You need me. This is why we gather.

Community is not about obligation so much as it is about the importance of being in relationship with one another. We support one another in our difficulties and celebrate our joys. We share our thoughts and knowledge, our reflections and experiences. We can do more together than we can do alone.

Gathering in community is *sacred and holy ground*. It is in community that we experience the presence of God as we live out the love that we have received from the One who created us.

This is why we gather!

We do not live our lives alone, but in the loving presence of the Lord our God as we gather in faith-filled community.

Rinse Your Returnables

Thank you for your continued support of our recycling program. Just a reminder—before you drop off your empties, please remember to rinse the glass bottles and cans (beer, soda, juice). This helps keep the deposit container clean and we don't run the risk of attracting rodents! Thank you!



TerraCycle has discontinued the #6 plastic cup recycling program. These cups can go in your curbside recycling so please do not bring them to Trinity anymore. Thanks for your help.



Are Ziploc Bags Recyclable?

Yes! Ziploc bags <u>ARE</u> **recyclable** (along with Hefty One Zip and other comparable zipper bags). While most curbside pick up programs do not accept most plastic bags, you can deposit them in bins at the grocery store for grocery bag recycling. (You can also put dry cleaning bags and other plastic sheeting in there). Find a location near you at <u>Earth911.org/recylcing</u> by searching for places to recycle "plastic bags."

Ziploc bags are made from polyethylene plastic resin number 4, which is difficult to recycle mostly because of its light weight. They get tangled in complicated recycling equipment. They are simple to recycle but must be kept completely separate from materials generally included in curbside pickup programs.

... and before you bring your stash of bags to the recycling center, make sure to reuse them as often as you can! Clean and dry them and give them as many go 'rounds as possible.

When possible, opt for reusable containers that never need to be disposed of.
