Pastoral Reflections - Gratitude

For our Wednesday evening study, we have been looking at the book "Gratitude: The Transforming Power of Giving Thanks" by Diana Butler Bass. She invites the reader to look beyond writing thank you notes and what she calls the "holding the turkey hostage" as we all name what we are thankful for on the day of Thanksgiving.

Both the words "gratitude" and "grace" have their roots in the Latin word "gratia" and the Greek word "kharis". The author writes "Grace means unmerited favor. When I think of grace, I particularly like the image of God tossing gifts around — a sort of indiscriminate giver of sustenance, joy, love and pleasure...Grace begets gratitude, which in turn, widens our hearts toward greater goodness and love." (pg. 19)

Grace is one of those words that we use a lot in church. It is more than just the saying of thanks over our meals. It is not something that we earn – we can't work our way into heaven. We can't earn the love of God. God already loves us – not because of what we do, but because we are created in God's image and are God's own.

Gratitude is our response to this grace – to the gift of life itself.

What are you grateful for today?

Many will name family, jobs, weather, health, etc. We are "good" at naming generic categories of thanks, but what about specifics related to each of these areas. What is it about one of

your family members – today – that you would like to thank God for? What happened in your life today – specifically – that brought you a sense of joy, of wonder?

And what about all those things – people, places, items in our possession – that we often take for granted? The check out clerk at the store. The people who produce our food. The roads that we drive. The alarm clock that wakes us up in the morning (okay, I'm not always thankful for that).

Bass also invites us to look at the difficult times in our lives – not so much about being thankful that they happened, but how we experienced God's grace in the midst of them. She quotes Henri Nouwen who wrote" "Still, we are only truly grateful people when we can say thank you to all that has brought us to the present moment." (The Spiritual work of gratitude).

Rather than waiting for Thanksgiving, let us take the opportunity during these summer months to learn to live thankfully, to recognize who God has worked and works through our daily lives. Let us be transformed by gratitude through the loving grace of God.


Off the Shelf

Mourning to Morning

When I arrived at Trinity Lutheran Church, there were numerous groups already meeting as a part of the ministry here as well as outside groups that use our building regularly. One of those groups was a "Bereavement" Group that had been meeting for years. It was a small group of widows that after awhile dwindled to just one person.

I had thought periodically about starting a new one and have thought more deliberately about it in this past year following my own husband's death.

Yet, the word "bereavement" or "grief" seemed like such sorrow filled words that I didn't even want to approach them. I got hung up on them even as much as I knew (and know) the benefits of such a group both for me personally as well as people in the congregation and community.

Its not that I - as well as others - aren't sorrow-filled over the death of our loved ones. But it seemed that this time is about so much more than just tears and grief.

It is about letting the tears flow when they need to along with waking up to each new day. It is not forgetting the past or our loved ones, but taking them with us in a new way as we embark on what life now holds in store. It is living in just this moment - because sometimes that is all that we can do.

It is about living from "mourning" to "morning".

I also thought about the different kinds of grief and mourning - not just the bereavement from the death of a loved one. People experience all kinds of losses in their lives - loss of job, health, divorce, other life circumstances, purpose, homes and the like.

So the question arose about how might a "grief group" help all of us in whatever kind of mourning we experience? Yes, there are different kinds of challenges with each kind of loss. However, that is true as well in the death of our loved ones - each relationship is different and filled with its own changes.

How do we - as a people of faith - live "mourning to morning"? How might we as fellow children of God walk with each other through not just our grief but the changes and challenges that we face daily?

We begin by gathering and sharing where we are in our journeys, our time of mourning. We pray with and for one another. We cry together and we laugh together. We share the comforting grace of Christ.

No program, no agenda to force us through our mourning; just the love and grace of God that washes over us and can bring us peace.

Hi, it's your Financial Gnome again. I popped up out of my gnome hole just to say a few things.

Bad News - It's nice and cool down in my hole. I would greatly appreciate it if everyone would keep up their contributions over the summer months, so I don't have to come out again during the heat of the summer to harangue you about financial shortfalls. Neither of us want that.

The Mortgage Fund is getting dangerously short of funds. I report great looking balances at the end of the month, but the next day the bank withdraws our \$3,565 payment. With May contributions less than \$2,500, if June runs the same, we will have less than \$1,000 after the July 1st payment. \$1,000 plus \$2,500 doesn't meet the August mortgage payment. Please don't let us default with five months until the mortgage is paid off.
