Pastoral reflections

It's been over 25 years since I've been in any kind of school setting, but I still have this undeniable urge to buy school supplies (which will be satisfied by donating to our LWR School Kits, see related article). There is just something about purchasing these items that exhibit a sense of hope and possibility.

Just as New Year's affords us a fresh start with the change from one year to the next, so too does the Fall as school resumes and life resumes its "normal" schedule (and yes, I do hear the collective groans of school kids everywhere as it does begin).

Newly sharpened pencils and blank notebooks beckon with creative thoughts about what will fill these pages. While I didn't always appreciate the information that filled my own school notebooks when I was growing up, they have come to mean so much more now. All that knowledge and information that I take for granted has afforded me opportunities as well as the impetus to apply this knowledge in different ways (for everything can be a sermon illustration).

I think about what I have forgotten or missed out in learning and how that might be of service to me today. Sometimes, I wish that I could go back now and relearn all that I've forgotten so that my life and world view might expand even more (Hello, Google, Siri, Alexa, Wikipedia, What is...?).

I confess that I didn't really remember much of what I learned in Confirmation and even specific lessons from Sunday school. It didn't really begin to make sense until I spent more time in looking at the stories of scripture as well as our Lutheran tradition. Even after seminary and so many years of ordained ministry, there are still times when I feel as if I have just scratched the surface.

For you see, it is not just about remembering certain facts and figures of our faith, it is about the ways in which they speak to us in our lives today – as a part of the community we inhabit, the experiences we each have had thus far, the world context and our current life situations.

Some stories or verses of scripture deepen in meaning as we encounter different moments in our lives. For instance, from I Thessalonians 5:17 "pray without ceasing" has often only seemed like a call to prayer for me. However, when I learned of my brother's death while I was at Pinecrest and was surrounded first by youth then other adult leaders who prayed over me and then as I heard of all of your prayers that followed me as I gathered with my family – I was being held unceasingly by each of your prayers.

While we may not buy a new Bible as often as we do school supplies, it does hold forth promise and possibility every time we open its pages. In worship, through the use of the Narrative lectionary that

retraces the narrative arc of scripture, in devotional practices that bring God's word into our daily lives and in faith formation, as we gather with others to explore the gift of scripture – we are invited anew to see the hope and possibility that God places before us. We come to see each new day through the lens of faith, of God with us – guiding, inspiring, comforting, nudging and encouraging us to live our faith as more than just something that we do, but more importantly as who and whose we are.

Come and experience the hope and possibilities that are offered in the gift of faith – as we gather in prayer, worship, conversation and fellowship. Come and see all that God is up to in our midst!




Trinity in the Community
