Pastoral reflections "Love the Lord and your neighbor as yourself"

It wasn't a day or so after Christmas when Valentine's candy began to fill the shelves. February has come to be seen as a kind of "love month" with hearts, candy and flowers on full display.

Love is at the heart of the Christian faith as well. Yet, love is more than just an emotion or a way that we feel about someone at any particular moment. My love for someone can waver and even those that I love the most can still annoy or frustrate me. There are times when I am not very loveable. Love can be fickle at best. Feelings can wane or be obscured. We use the word "love" for everything from our favorite kind of food to our family, from a sports team to a sunset. We use "love" as kind of catchall term.

So, what is love?

In Greek, there are different words for the different kinds of love – such as: *eros* (romantic), *philo* (friendship) and *agape* (unconditional love). They recognized that love does take many different forms and it is not a one-size fits all.

One of the most used scripture passages for weddings is that one that St. Paul wrote about love (I Corinthians 13). It is often viewed from the romantic vantage point of love rather than the true intent of the Greek *agape*. When we view it from this very human perspective, placing ourselves into the passage, we miss the richness of what Paul is trying to convey.

⁴ **Love** is patient; **love** is kind; **love** is not envious or boastful or arrogant ⁵ or rude. **It** does not insist on its own way; **it** is not irritable or resentful; ⁶ **it** does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. ⁷ **It** bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. ⁸ **Love** never ends.

I want you to read it three different ways:

Read it as printed

Replace all the **bolded** words with your name

Replace all the **bolded** words with Jesus' name

When I read it with my name, I find all the ways that I am lacking, the ways that I have failed to live up to these ideals of love. I can think of times daily when I haven't been kind or patient, when I've been arrogant or boastful. In using this passage at a wedding or for any relationship, it is as if we are setting ourselves up to fail.

Yet, when it read it from the standpoint of *agape* and God's love for us, we find first of all the richness of what God's love looks like for us. Then, trusting in this love that is given to us, we are empowered to share this same love – not from our own meager abilities – but from the fullness of all the love that we have received.

We are called upon the love the Lord our God and to love our neighbors as ourselves. Our love from a human standpoint is not enough – yet God's love is abundant. When our love wavers or is unable to be fully felt or expressed, God's love overflows.

For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son..." (John 3:16). This is the proclamation that sustains and calls us forth into the world to share all that we have received.
