Pastoral Reflections - Stewards of God's Creation

"In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth... God blessed humankind and said to them, be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth, and subdue it and have dominion..." (Genesis 1-2)

For too long, humanity has taken this phrase "to subdue and have dominion" over the earth as permission to do whatever we want with creation. The Hebrew that is used here (*rada*) that we translate as "dominion" is more about nurturing and caregiving rather than having power over something. "Subdue" (*kabas*) is more about creating order and the ongoing creative process. In other words, we are blessed to be stewards of what God has created. It is God's world (including us) and not owned by us. All of creation is on loan to use faithfully, and we are tasked with taking care of what God has made.

There are many conversations going on around climate change. Unfortunately, it has become one of those divisive issues in our culture. While as a church, we seek to separate ourselves from pure politics and not take political stands, we are still called as Christians to speak out on issues of justice. In our Affirmation service, part of the promise that we make is to "strive for justice and peace in all the earth.

The ELCA has adopted social statements that address a wide variety of social issues. They are not political statements, but rather based on scripture and our faith that calls us to live according to God's will for justice, peace and love expressed to all people. One of those statements is about creation. You can read it in full by picking up a copy at church or by going to: www.elca.org/Faith/Faith-and-Society/Social-Statements/Caring-for-Creation.

Its stated purpose is: Caring for Creation expresses a call to pursue justice for creation through active participation, solidarity, sufficiency and sustainability, and states the commitments of the ELCA for pursuing wholeness for creation — commitments expressed through individual and community action, worship, learning, moral deliberation and advocacy.

As people of God's creation, we acknowledge our calling to care for what has been entrusted to us. We seek to not just be faithful stewards on our own, but are called to encourage and support others who are doing the same. We act – not out of political motivation – but as Christians called to live into God's will for all of creation.

Our newly formed Stewards of God's Creation team has begun some expanded recycling efforts at church to help us as we seek to take care of what God has entrusted to us. We have a month long emphasis to care for creation that was begun on April 22nd, Earth Day. There are numerous resources and ways to participate that you can find in this newsletter. If you have any additional ideas, please feel free to share them with our Creation team or you are invited to be a part of it as well.

Let us faithfully serve God as we seek to be stewards of all that has been placed in our time.

- 2) If you could create a new animal, plant, etc., what would you create?
- 3) What is one thing that you commit to doing to take care of God's creation?
- 4) How might you encourage others to take care of God's creation as well?

As spring continues to spring around us, watch for new signs of life and offer up a prayer of thanks for this gift of creation.

Use these prayers as a part of your prayer practices:

Merciful Creator, your hand is open wide to satisfy the needs of every living creature. Make us always thankful for your loving providence; and grant that we, remembering the account that we must one day give, may be faithful stewards of your good gifts, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen. (ELW, pg. 63)

In the beginning God created all things, and God saw that they were good. At our beginning, God created us unique and irreplaceable, loved and wanted by God, known and treasured by God even before He created us.

In all our new beginnings, God creates something new so we will seek God in the freshness of this morning, in the laughter of friends, in the colors of creation, and in this beautiful place. Lord God, King of Creation, open our eyes to see your presence, our souls to sense your presence, and our hearts to love your presence, ever here in your creation, and ever beyond it in eternity.Amen.

Metro NY Synod Assembly



Off the Shelf -Here are some books to check out as we focus on being good stewards of God's creation:




"Holy Ground: A gathering of voices on caring for creation": ed. by Lyndsay Moseley and the Sierra Club books






Putnam CAP

Later that evening, we returned to the store with our collective donations of more than \$1000, to purchase more food and gift cards. The kids learned how to stretch a penny on a budget and purchase items that will make several meals for many people. The kids also enjoyed a friendly competition, boys against the girls, to see who would get closer to their target funds. The girls won!

Before bed we all joined in the sanctuary to debrief on the lessons of the day and ended with prayer. All the kids thought it was a positive experience and would like to ask other churches to participate. The next morning they attended service and enjoyed a well deserved meal!
