

Pastoral Reflections - "We believe..."

On Sunday, June 2nd, five of our young people affirmed the promises that were made to them in baptism: John & Jennifer Gerfen, Angelina Giacomelli, Jasmine Moscato and Victoria Sciarra. It is such a blessing to see these young people share their witness about their beliefs and understandings about God. It is a joy to watch them as they grow in faith over the years.

One of the highlights for me is to hear the ways in which they express their faith in their own statements of faith that they are each asked to write. They share what it is that they believe about God and God's role in their life and in the world.

What do you believe about God? What might your own statement of faith include?

During worship, we profess together our faith using the

words of the Apostles' or Nicene Creeds that were developed by the early church in the 4th century (and there is also the Anthanasian Creed). It began as a way to clarify the beliefs of the Church as many different understandings were at work, particularly in relationship to Christ's divinity and humanity.

More than stating what we believe as a matter of doctrine, creeds and statements of faith express our relationship with God and the role of God in our lives and in the world. It is not about adhering to particular doctrines, but proclaiming the centrality of God in our midst. Through these Creeds, we profess the ways that we have experienced God as Creator, as our Savior and as the Spirit who continues to act in our lives today.

So, I share with you the witness of these five young people as they have made public profession of their faith and trust in God.

Peace in Christ, Pastar Jen

Leave A Lighter Footprint

School is out. The family is ready for a summer vacation. While packing for a vacation, carry the reduce, reuse, and recycle slogan with you, thinking of ways you can avoid adding to the trash left behind by fellow travelers. Popular destinations attract millions of visitors, who create hundreds of tons of trash requiring removal. Much of the trash are the convenient disposable items, which are tossed after a single use. Two billion plastic razors and blades are thrown out by Americans each year. Replace plastic disposables with a metal safety razor. Men might even try growing a beard (just kidding). On the road, pack lunches and snacks. Although restaurants are working hard to remove plastic forks, spoons, and straws, take-out restaurants still rely on a combination of recyclable/ compostable containers containers with plastic lids. Replace plastic water bottles with reusable, refillable bottles. On a camping trip, unpack new camping gear at home, reducing the amount of cardboard and plastic brought to the park. If you do not intend to become a serious camping devotee, rent or borrow camping gear. Pack reusable utensils, or wash and reuse plastic utensils instead of discarding them after one use. The most common trash according to park rangers are plastic bags, cups, bottles and straws. Reducing and reusing is still the best way to eliminate the amount of trash in our national parks. When visiting a museum, use your smartphone to download tickets, use the museum map apps or refer to the posted museum signs for directions or guidance. A spokesman for the Louvre listed maps and entrance tickets as the majority of the 1,200 tons of waste accumulated during the year. Although the museum does recycle paper, visitors could reduce the amount of waste by using smart phones for paperless alternatives. Enjoy the summer. Remember the 3 R's: Reduce, Reuse, and Recycle.

Mision Trip to San Lucas Toliman: Pastor Jen will be traveling with a group from St Andrew's Lutheran Church (Yorktown) on a mission trip to Guatemala (June 23-June 30). She hopes to post updates on social media.



Some Histroy about the mission: In 1963, Father Greg Schaffer, from the diocese of New Ulm, MN, came to San Lucas Toliman and began work as a parish priest. Responding to the expressed needs of the community he realized that his work as a priest would be broader than he had imagined. He soon started programs in education, healthcare, construction, coffee as well as a visitor's program inviting groups from the United States to walk alongside the people and culture of San Lucas. Fr. Greg died in 2012 and the Friends of San Lucas was born to carry on his legacy of working with the people of San Lucas to alleviate the process of poverty. Currently, the Friends of San Lucas supports the Mission in Guatemala, which employs over 100 people working in all program areas. Almost all of the support for the work of the Mission comes through private donations.
