

Pastoral Reflections Savior of the Nations, come

Moving through the twelve days of Christmas brings us to Epiphany. January 6th is the day that we remember when the wise men from the East followed the star in order that they might bring gifts to Jesus. While, we only designate these twelve days for travel, it is likely that it did not happen that quickly (remember – no super highways or air travel). This account only appears in Matthew (chp. 2) following his version of Jesus' birth. People are drawn to Christ from all nations. From Jesus' ministry to the Gentiles throughout the Gospels to Paul's travels throughout his known world, the path of the Magi is replicated. Many have been drawn to that babe in the manger in all times and in all places.

Epiphany is a season of revelation, of the light dawning on high in the dim places of our world. This season draws us together as God's people scattered across the globe. As the days ever so slowly grow longer, our eyes are opened to the ways Christ's love and grace has been revealed to all people in every nation.

Many people in recent years have begun to explore their family trees – now made more possible through DNA tests. Some have discovered connections that they never knew about previously. Our backgrounds are made up of many different nations. Our ancestors paths have crossed in years past just as our own cross today. While we live together in one nation, we are from many nations (that's one of the blessings of living in this country with its rich diversity).

Jesus was born for all people – "God so loved the world" (John 3:16). While born in Bethlehem, his message of grace and love was poured out upon everyone in every place. This message could not be contained to one city, much less one country. It has been passed from generation to generation. Before he ascended into heaven, Jesus said to his disciples to "go into all nations" (Matthew 28:19) to bring this Good News. And as such, the whole Bible itself has been translated into 670 languages (portions of it into 3,312 languages with still more than 2000 of the known 7000 languages that await translation; source: https://www.wycliffe.org/about/why)

To celebrate and to highlight this diversity within our own congregation, we will be having different people share the Lord's Prayer in other languages. Each week in Epiphany, we will hear from our ancestors (known & unknown) in a variety of tongues. It will be a bit of a Pentecost moment when the disciples spoke in many different languages to spread the Gospel (Acts 2).

If you are willing to share the Lord's Prayer in a language that you know, please contact me. I have about 8 weeks that I would like to have a different language spoken.

Or maybe you want to try to learn the Lord's Prayer in the language of one of your ancestors or one that interests you. Take this as your Epiphany challenge – a way to learn and grow in faith and understanding of how the Good News is spread throughout the earth.

Faith @ Home – Bless your Home



Epiphany falls on January 6th - the last day of the Christmas season which marks the visit of the Magi to baby Jesus.

Matthew writes that when the magi saw the shining star stop overhead, they were filled with joy. "On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother" (Matt. 2:10-11). In the home, Christ is met in family and friends, in visitors and strangers. In the home, faith is shared, nurtured, and put into action. In the home, Christ is welcome.

Twelfth Night (January 5), Epiphany of Our Lord (January 6), or another day during the time after Epiphany offers an occasion for gathering with friends and family members for a blessing of the home. Someone may lead the greeting and blessing, while another person may read the scripture passage. Following an eastern European tradition, a visual blessing may be inscribed with white chalk above the main door; for example, 20 + CMB + 18. The numbers change with each new year. The three letters either the ancient stand for Latin blessing Christe mansionem benedicat, which means, "Christ, bless this house," or the legendary names of the magi (Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar).

The following can be used for blessing your home:

GREETING

May peace be to this house and to all who enter here. By wisdom a house is built and through understanding it is established; through knowledge its rooms are filled with rare and beautiful treasures. (*Proverbs 24:3-4*)

READING

As we prepare to ask God's blessing on this household, let us listen to the words of scripture.

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. (John 1:1-4, 14, 16)

INSCRIPTION

This inscription may be made with chalk above the entrance:

20 + C M B + 18

Write the appropriate character (left) while speaking the text (right).

The magi of old, known as

- C Caspar,
- M Melchior, and
- B Balthasar

followed the star of God's Son who came to dwell among us

- 20 two thousand
- 18 and eighteen years ago.

+ Christ, bless this house,

+ and remain with us throughout the new year.

PRAYER OF BLESSING

O God, you revealed your Son to all people by the shining light of a star. We pray that you bless this home and all who live here with your gracious presence. May your love be our inspiration, your wisdom our guide, your truth our light, and your peace our benediction; through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Then everyone may walk from room to room, blessing the house with incense or by sprinkling with water, perhaps using a branch from the Christmas tree.

Social Ministry for 2019




If so, what was it and how is it going? If you were to make a faith resolution, what might it be?

What might you need to help you live into this commitment?


Faith Formation
