## Pastoral Reflections Time Leap

But do not ignore this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like one day. (2 Peter 3:8)

Have you ever had one of those days that seem to last forever or go by in the blink of an eye? They say that time moves faster as you grow older. And I remember being younger and feeling like the day would never come when I would graduate, be able to drive, go to college, etc. Time is one of those funny things that Einstein tried to make sense of with his theory of relativity (E=mc2) which I certainly don't understand.

Despite how fast or slow it seems to go, the clock keeps ticking with 24 hours in a day filled with 1,440 minutes and 86,400 seconds. Time is the only thing that we can't increase or decrease. Everyone gets the same amount every day. We might use sayings like "can you spare a minute" or "give me a second", but we can't control how time passes.

Except every 4 years, we get a whole new day and this is one of those years. . This addition to our calendar helps to re-align our days to the seasons. We even have a few Leap Year "babies" in the congregation (see birthday list) – so make sure you wish them a Happy Birthday since they only get one every four years.

What will you do with this "extra' day? What difference does it make in your own

calendar, your own daily schedule? Or does it?

God's time is not our time, but our time is indeed God's. Just as we look at the world around us and are reminded that everything is God's gift to us, so too is time itself. All those minutes and seconds, the rising and the setting of the sun, the changing seasons – they are all given to us as a gift of God's grace.

We may not be able to increase or decrease time – no matter how slow or fast it seems to go – but we are invited to be mindful of the time that we are given. We can take the time to pause and give thanks for the moments we are blessed to spend with others. We can view the time we are given as that gift that enables us to work, to play, to rest and to create.

With the gift of an extra day at the end of the month, we can mark the gift of this day in a variety of ways. Here are a few suggestions:

- Use it as a time for prayer. Pick a time during the day – a very specific time (maybe use the date of your birth – for example, I might pick 6:26pm) to set aside as that moment to pray. Set an alarm on your most used clock as a reminder.
- 2) Spend time with that person that you keep saying that you want to catch up

with. Or maybe someone you know who is going through a tough time.

- Share this gift of time in acts of service. Volunteer your time with a local agency or even just take the time to learn about some of the ministries happening in our area or around the world.
- Use it as Sabbath time where you don't plan anything. Rest, re-create, play, pray, worship, etc.

How will use this God-given gift of this extra day? How will you be mindful of each day, of all the times of your life?

This is the day that the Lord has made, we are indeed glad and rejoice in it?



## **Altar Guild Help Needed**

We are currently looking for new Altar Guild members as we have lost 3 members over the past few years. Being a member consists of three major tasks: setup for service, clean up after service and changing the paraments. Setup takes about 20 minutes. Cleanup takes about the same. Changing the paraments takes about 30 minutes. Members typically serve a month at a time, but other members can fill if you can't commit to a particular week.

The weekly service responsibilities include preparing the chalices, replacing the water in the bowl in the baptismal font, adding oil to the altar candles and the eternal candle, filling the wine decanter, and adding hosts to the host container, and replacing the white cloths and cleaning the chalices for the second Sunday service. The second service cleans up after.

During the year if the color of the paraments changes, silver and brass require polishing or there is a special setup for holidays, I or members of the team are available to help. We are flexible and always work around scheduling issues. If you are unsure if you want to make a commitment and would like to see us in action please let me know and I will schedule a time to show you.

#### Property Update


This morning in Shepherds Hall, Sunday January 26, I enjoyed sitting with many of you for our annual meeting. Listening to presenters and reading through the report and committee summaries was uplifting in many ways. It's wonderful to see how each one of us gives of our time and talents within committees in specific ways; and how our efforts all merge to further the master plan that God has given us in spreading the Gospel of our Lord.

At property, we have recently had our entry locks replaced and new keys issued and some doors, closures and saddles reset for ease of opening and closing. In hindsight, I found one of the attendees at a nightly meeting here at Trinity is a locksmith and he would have been more than helpful in that work if I had only known to ask him. Ken von Bargen gave me a very good tip on flipping hinges top to bottom, bottom to top in trying to fix door alignment. (tension vs compression) He also gave me a heads up about how to run LED lights on the ballasts that are already in place.
