Listed here is the order of worship so that you are able to follow along. We have included links to the hymns and an anthem picked by Franklyn that you may either listen to in addition to our online service

Congregational responses are in **bold** that you are invited to read aloud wherever you may be worshipping. Though I cannot hear you, we know that we are speaking together from where we all are for God's ears and attention.

Setting up for <u>Pentecost</u>: Color and cut out the coloring page (see link in announcements) to adorn your worship space. Wear red (or other flame-like colors) as a sign of the Spirit's presence in our midst. Take a picture and post to Trinity's Facebook page and/or send to Pastor Jen to post. Set aside some sacred space where you are to worship and prayer. Light a candle (or more), set out your Bible and/or a cross. Spend a few moments in silence before you begin.

Introduction: On Pentecost, God gave the gift of the Holy Spirit to those gathered, and in doing so they were able to discern voices speaking God's truth.

READING: Acts 2:1-4

READING: 1 Corinthians 12:4-13

Now concerning spiritual gifts, brothers and sisters, I do not want you to be uninformed. ² You know that when you were pagans, you were enticed and led astray to idols that could not speak. ³ Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking by the Spirit of God ever says "Let Jesus be cursed!" and no one can say "Jesus is Lord" except by the Holy Spirit.

⁴ Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; ⁵ and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; ⁶ and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. ⁷ To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. ⁸ To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, ⁹ to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, ¹⁰ to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. ¹¹ All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.

¹² For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. ¹³ For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.


Re-open Plans: We have put together a task force to look into what we need to have prepared related to precautions, changes and procedures. We will keep you up to date on what is being done.

Although our community offices are temporarily closed, the Fidelis Care team is ready to serve individuals by phone at 1-866-435-9521 (TTY: 711). We can answer individuals' questions and help them enroll or to Re-new their coverage by phone.

NY State of Health and the New York State Department of Financial Services recently announced that <u>a Special Enrollment Period is available to New Yorkers, now through June 15th</u>, during which eligible individuals are able to enroll in insurance coverage through the Marketplace and directly through insurers. This step is being taken to further protect the health of New Yorkers during the COVID-19 public health emergency.

Fidelis Care can assist anyone who may need health insurance coverage for themselves and their family members <u>especially those whose working hours may have been, or will be cut back or in the worst case face a temporary or permanent layoff or loss of job and the loss of health insurance medical benefits coverage.</u> We are here and we are ready to assist families, adults, and children throughout New York State receive quality, affordable, health care insurance coverage.
