DEVOTIONS

Think about devotions as a continuation of our community's worship. The following basic pattern could be one way of forming your household's devotions. Adapt as necessary.

GATHERING

✤ Light a candle to help you focus this time as "God time."

☆ Prayer of the Week

Light of the world, beam bright into our hearts. Create in us a new way to shine so that your love may be clearly seen. Teach us to care, share, and dwell with one another, resembling the nightly sky above, examples of your heavenly work. Amen.

CARING CONVERSATION

Take a moment to check in with each other or to use the questions below.

- Highs and Lows: Where did you shine bright today? Where did you not shine so bright?
- Thinking About This Week's Story: Even though Abram and Sarai had no children, God promised them many descendants. God cared about Abram, Sarai and their family. In what ways, do you feel God's love and care in your daily life?
- Getting Ready for Next Week's Story: Pushed into a pit and sold into slavery, Joseph, Jacob's favored son, finds himself between a rock and a hard place. But no matter where he went, God was with him. Name a time today when you felt bad. Did you feel God was with you? How?

DAILY BIBLE READING

Read aloud from the DAILY BIBLE READING from the front. What do you want to remember from this reading?

PRAY TOGETHER

✿ Go outside or look out the window, and count how many stars you can see. For each star counted, name one person you are grateful for and why.

CLOSING

earrow If you used a candle, extinguish it as a sign of the end of the devotion time.

Trace a star on the hands of one another, and say, "May God's love shine within you for all the world to see. Amen."
