Looking at your whole creation, you called it very good...and you made us in your image. Yet we confess that we have not mastered the ability to love everyone. We have made love into a feeling and reserved it for a few, rather than seeing it as a way of living that insists on justice for all. We lament the divisions, the supremacy, the inherent inequity of our way of limited love.

(silence)

God-with-us, you came to live among us, to share our humanity in all its pain and joy. We confess that too often, our relationships are built on assumptions. We are not good at listening, or at seeking to understand the other's position. We assume they know, or feel, what we know and feel, and so our empathy is limited. We lament the broken relationships in our past and our present, the misunderstanding and the pain that we have caused. (brief silence) God who is Three and yet One, your eternal dance of unity inspires us. We confess that we have made it a heavenly ideal we never intend to reach on earth. We see the beautiful simplicity of your Trinity, and the messy complexity of our family dynamics, and decide no one would expect us to try. We lament the strained connections, the missed opportunities, and the abuse of power so often marring our family life. (brief silence) Compassionate God, we are sorry sorry for the hurt we have caused, to those near to us and those we will never meet. We recognize that pain, for we share it too. We ask your forgiveness, and your healing grace. Show us a more excellent way of love for you, for ourselves, for our neighbor. We ask for your help, in Christ's name. Amen.

Friends, hear and believe this good news: through Christ, God's grace is for us all. In Christ, the old way has gone and a new way has begun. So let us live like Christ, trusting God's promise and sharing God's abundant love. Thanks be to God. Amen.

# READING: Genesis 37:2-8, 17b-34 and 50:15-21 ||

**Reader 1:** <sup>3</sup>Now Israel loved Joseph more than any other of his children, because he was the son of his old age; and he had made him a long robe with sleeves. <sup>4</sup>But when his brothers saw that their father loved him more than all his brothers, **they hated him, and could not speak peaceably to him.** 5 Once Joseph had a dream, and when he told it to his brothers, they hated him even more. <sup>6</sup>He said to them,

**Reader 2:** 'Listen to this dream that I dreamed. <sup>7</sup>There we were, binding sheaves in the field. Suddenly my sheaf rose and stood upright; then your sheaves gathered around it, and bowed down to my sheaf.' <sup>8</sup>His brothers said to him, 'Are you indeed to reign over us? Are you indeed to have dominion over us?'

**Reader 1:** So they hated him even more because of his dreams and his words. So Joseph went after his brothers, and found them at Dothan. <sup>18</sup>They saw him from a distance, and before he came near to them, they conspired to kill him. <sup>19</sup>They said to one another, **'Here comes this dreamer.** <sup>20</sup>**Come now, let us kill him and throw him into one of the pits; then we shall say that a wild animal has devoured him, and we shall see what will become of his dreams.'** 

Reader 2: <sup>21</sup>But when Reuben heard it, he delivered him out of their hands, saying,

'Let us not take his life.' <sup>22</sup>Reuben said to them, 'Shed no blood; throw him into this pit here in the wilderness, but lay no hand on him'—that he might rescue him out of their hand and restore him to his father. <sup>26</sup>Then Judah said to his brothers, **'What profit is there if we kill our brother and conceal his blood? <sup>27</sup>Come, let us sell him to the Ishmaelites, and not lay our hands on him, for he is our brother, our own flesh.'** 

**Reader 1:** And his brothers agreed. <sup>28</sup>When some Midianite traders passed by, they drew Joseph up, lifting him out of the pit, and sold him to the Ishmaelites for twenty pieces of silver. And they took Joseph to Egypt. **Reader 2:** 29 When Reuben returned to the pit and saw that Joseph was not in the pit, he tore his clothes. <sup>30</sup>He returned to his brothers, and said, 'The boy is gone; and I, where can I turn?' <sup>31</sup>Then they took Joseph's robe, slaughtered a goat, and dipped the robe in the blood. <sup>32</sup>They had the long robe with sleeves taken to their father, and they said, '**This we have found; see now whether it is your son's robe or not.'** 

**Reader 1:** <sup>33</sup>He recognized it, and said, 'It is my son's robe! A wild animal has devoured him; Joseph is without doubt torn to pieces.' <sup>34</sup>Then Jacob tore his garments, and put sackcloth on his loins, and mourned for his son for many days.

**(Note:** (*The intervening chapters tell Joseph's saga that results in being in the Egyptian court where his brothers find him during a time of drought*)

**Reader 2:** 50:15 Realizing that their father was dead, Joseph's brothers said, 'What if Joseph still bears a grudge against us and pays us back in full for all the wrong that we did to him?' <sup>16</sup>So they approached Joseph, saying, 'Your father gave this instruction before he died, <sup>17</sup>"Say to Joseph: **I beg you, forgive the crime of your brothers and the wrong they did in harming you."** Now therefore please forgive the crime of the servants of the God of your father.'

**Reader 1:** Joseph wept when they spoke to him. <sup>18</sup>Then his brothers also wept, fell down before him, and said, 'We are here as your slaves.'<sup>19</sup>But Joseph said to them, 'Do not be afraid! Am I in the place of God?<sup>20</sup> Even though you intended to do harm to me, God intended it for good, in order to preserve a numerous people, as he is doing today.

**Reader 2:** <sup>21</sup>So have no fear; I myself will provide for you and your little ones.' In this way he reassured them, speaking kindly to them.

**Music Notes:** *Joseph (HWV 59)* is an oratorio by Georg Frideric Haendel completed in the summer of 1743. Joseph is composed to an English language libretto by the Reverend James Miller, based on Apostolo Zeno's Italian language It received its premiere performance that following Lenten season on 2 March 1744 at the Covent Garden Theatre. The libretto is hard to read without background context because the audience of Handel's oratorios was very familiar with the stories of the Hebrew Bible and would have known the whole story of Joseph as part of their cultural knowledge.

John Bucchino (born 1952) is an American songwriter of both lyrics and music, an accompanist, a cabaret performer, and a teacher. He has been called "super-talented". Stephen Schwartz said his songs have "insightful lyrics and gorgeous melodies", "rich harmonic textures and subtle...inner voicings." His music has "beautiful intricacies."


Altar Flowers: Since we are meeting in person for worship, if you would like to have flowers placed on the altar, please contact Kathie Ruhs.
