
Worship at Trinity Lutheran Church October 18, 2020

HYMNS: While we gather for in-person worship, we will not be singing any of the hymns. We will either speak the words responsively and/or listen to the accompaniment. All the words have been included for devotional use.

Setting up: Set aside some sacred space where you are to worship and prayer. Light a candle (or more), set out your Bible and/or a cross. Spend a few moments in silence before you begin.

Music Notes: Baldassare Galuppi (18 October 1706 – 3 January 1785) was a Venetian composer, born on the island of Burano and was called II Buranello. His father was a barber, who also played the violin in theatre orchestras, and is believed to have been his son's first music teacher. He was trained in composition and harpsichord by Antonio Lotti, the chief organist at St Mark's Basilica. In 1740, Galuppi was appointed director of music at the Ospedale dei Mendicanti in Venice, where his duties ranged from teaching and conducting to composing liturgical music and oratorios. In his first year of service at the Mendicanti, he composed 6 motets, 13 settings of the *Salve Regina*, and two psalm settings. Although he became internationally known as an operatic composer, he maintained a steady output of sacred music throughout his career. In April 1762 Galuppi was appointed to the leading musical post in Venice, *maestro di capella* of St Mark's, and in July of the same year he was also appointed choir master at the Ospedale degli Incurabili. At St Mark's, he set about reforming the choir. He persuaded the Basilica authorities, the Procurators, to be more flexible in payments to singers.

Paul Joseph Baloche (b.1962) is an American Christian music artist, worship leader, and singer-songwriter. A native of Maple Shade
Township, New Jersey, Baloche was the worship pastor at Community
Christian Fellowship in Lindale, Texas for 26 years. He and his wife, Rita
left Texas in January 2015, moving to New York City to be nearer family.
Baloche composes on piano and acoustic guitar, favoring guitar when
leading worship. His wife, Rita Baloche, is also a Christian songwriter.



We learned this week that our supermarket partners cannot permit food drives this year. This will have a devastating impact on the delivery of our Thanksgiving Basket Program. Modifying time-tested processes isn't going to be easy but it's essential that we acknowledge the limitations and adhere to all health and safety guidelines.

A difficult decision has been made to accept donations of *turkeys only* every Monday through Friday at the CAP office during November. We'll be reaching out to several local service organizations to ask for their help with pies, rolls and butter: items that can easily be handled without the need for additional manpower.

Adjusting our sails means that we are asking for donations of turkeys and \$25 grocery store gift cards for Thanksgiving by November 13th to ensure that families receive these cards in time to shop for themselves.

The end result will be families enjoying delicious, traditional Thanksgiving meals as plentiful as what we've provided in past year.

Holiday Toys

Holiday Toys presented us with a similar dilemma. How do we safely ensure all our children receive gifts at the holidays? Adequate space for this program has always been a challenge, but this year it is particularly daunting. There isn't a place we know with enough space to accommodate this program and at the same time ensure a safe environment with room to guarantee social distancing for all involved.

Another difficult decision was reached to distribute store gift cards to the parents for the purchase of gifts for their own children. Our modest goal is to guarantee that each child receives \$50 worth of gifts. Sufficient time must be allotted for parents to shop around, search for the right items, take advantage of sales, perhaps order online and wait for holiday delivery.
