Think about devotions as a continuation of our community's worship. The following basic pattern could be one way of forming your household's devotions. Adapt as necessary!

GATHERING

♣ Light a candle to help you focus this time as "God time."

† Prayer of the Week

Sending God, You call us by name, and we want to serve others. You ask us to serve, and we share what we have. You lead us by example, and we want to love our neighbors. Help us as we serve, share and, love. Amen.

CARING CONVERSATION

Take a moment to check in with each other or to use the questions below.

- P Highs and Lows: Name one thing that happened today that seemed special. Name one thing that happened today that seemed boring.
- Thinking About This Week's Story: Isaiah encountered God in the temple, and God sent him out with a message. Who have you encountered today? Did you share any messages today?
- Getting Ready for Next Week's Story: God makes a new promise with the people to help them remember to put God first in everything they do. How did you put God first today? How can you do so tomorrow?

DAILY BIBLE READING

Read aloud from the DAILY BIBLE READING from the front. What do you want to remember from this reading?

PRAY TOGETHER

♥ With a candle lit, turn off the lights. While focusing on the candle, say a silent prayer.

CLOSING

[†] If you used a candle, extinguish it as a sign of the end of the devotion time.

Prituals & Traditions: A Blessing to Share

Mark one another with the sign of the cross on each other's hands or forehead, and say, "Servant of God, go and share God's love with others. Amen."
