Think about devotions as a continuation of our community's worship. The following basic pattern could be one way of forming your household's devotions. Adapt as necessary!

GATHERING

♣ Light a candle to help you focus this time as "God time."

† Prayer of the Week

God of law, help us to love you, and help us to love others as ourselves. God of love, help us to know down deep that we are loved. We are your people and know that your laws come from your love for us. Amen.

CARING CONVERSATION

Take a moment to check in with each other or to use the questions below.

- Highs and Lows: What is something that you loved about today? What is something that you did not love today?
- Thinking About This Week's Story: God called the people to repent, to change their ways. What was a change you made today? What is a change you want to make tomorrow?
- Getting Ready for Next Week's Story: Daniel gets locked up in a lions' den. But Daniel trusted that God will save him. When did you need to trust someone today? When did someone have to trust you?

DAILY BIBLE READING

Read aloud from the DAILY BIBLE READING from the front. What do you want to remember from this reading?

PRAY TOGETHER

♣ Go in a circle and pray for one change that you need help making.

CLOSING

♣ If you used a candle, extinguish it as a sign of the end of the devotion time.

Partials & Traditions: A Blessing to Share

Mark one another with the sign of the cross on each other's hands or forehead, and say, "You have been marked by the love of God forever. Amen."
