Dearly beloved,

This scriptural translation from The Message of Paul's letter to the Romans was shared in an e-newsletter that I recently received (see below for the link) and while the article was talking about year round stewardship, one word jumped out at me – "ordinary". Nothing seems ordinary or "normal" about these "unprecedented" days (can we agree to either find a different word or not use this for at least 20 years or so). We long for ordinary, normal and even mundane. So here's what I want you to do, God helping you: Take your everyday, ordinary life—your sleeping, eating, going-to-work, and walking-around life—and place it before God as an offering. Embracing what God does for you is the best thing you can do for him...Readily recognize what he wants from you, and quickly respond to it.

(Romans 12:1-2; The Message)

Yet, despite the lack of ordinariness of our lives, we are called and invited to place each of our moments before God as an offering. We offer up our hopes and our fears, our worries and our celebrations. We offer our families, our jobs, our homes and our relationships. We offer all that we are, all that we have and all that we hope to be to the One who gives it all to us, trusting that God will use even our lack of ordinariness to bear much fruit.

Trusting that God does bring new life out of these unprecedented days, we live in hope. We act deliberately in anticipation of what Christ can accomplish in and through us. We seek to not be conformed to the fear, anger and worry of this world, but transformed by the hope and promise of God's amazing grace. We live faithfully in response to this grace.

As such, we are inviting you in the midst of these days to make a commitment for the coming year. As we move into the possibilities of what God has in store for us, we ask you to prayerfully consider your pledge for the coming year. You will find a **commitment form** with this letter.
