HOLY GOSPEL: John 1:1-14

The Holy Gospel according to John, the first chapter. Glory to you, O Lord

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was in the beginning with God. ³ All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being ⁴ in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. ⁵ The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

⁶ There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. ⁷ He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. ⁸ He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. ⁹ The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.

¹⁰ He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. ¹¹ He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. ¹² But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, ¹³ who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God.

¹⁴ And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth.

REFLECTION

SHARING OUR BLESSINGS

BLESSING OF OUR NATIVITY/CRECHE:

- 3) If you could put yourself into this scene, who would you want to be and why?

READING: Luke 2

After arriving in Bethlehem, the time came for Mary to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

Meanwhile, shepherds keeping watch in the fields were amazed at angels who announced to them the birth of the Messiah. So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

BLESSING: O Lord our God, with Mary and Joseph, angels and shepherds, and the animals in the stable, we gather around your Son born for us. Bless us with your holy presence and inspired us to help those who have no place to dwell. Be with us that we might share Christ's love with all the world, for he is our light and our salvation. Glory in heaven and peace on earth, now and forever. Amen.

BLESSING OF OUR CHRISTMAS TREE:

READING: Genesis 2:8-9

And the LORD God planted a garden in Eden, in the east; and there he put the man whom he had formed. Out of the ground the LORD God made to grow every tree that is pleasant to the sight and good for food, the tree of life also in the midst of the garden, and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil.

BLESSING: God our Creator, we praise you for this Christmas tree, gift of the earth and sign of your evergreen presence. As we illumine this tree, let your blessing come upon us. Send us your Son, the tender branch of Jesse, who brings us light and life. May we who stand in it light eagerly welcome the true Light which never fades, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

BLESSING OF ONE ANOTHER:

- 2) How do you plan to connect with those who you are unable to be with this year?
- **3)** What is your prayer for others?

READING: Philippians 4:4-9

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you.

BLESSING: O Lord of heaven and earth, you created us in your image and made us to be in relationship with each another. We mourn that we are not able to gather in the ways that we would like; yet, we know that You are not limited by time and space. Your Spirit moves amidst us, filling us with peace and joy. Bless all of our gatherings, no matter the means by which we connect. May we know always that you have made us to be the Body of Christ wherever we may be. We pray this in the most holy name of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
