At that very time there were some present who told him about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. He asked them, “Do you think that because these Galileans suffered in this way they were worse sinners than all other Galileans? No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish as they did. At that very hour some Pharisees came and said to him, “Get away from here, for Herod wants to kill you.” He said to them, “Go and tell that fox for me, ‘Listen, I am casting out demons and performing cures today and tomorrow, and on the third day I finish my work. Yet today, tomorrow, and the next day I must be on my way, because it is impossible for a prophet to be killed outside of Jerusalem.’ Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it! How often have I desired to gather your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you were not willing! See, your house is left to you. And I tell you, you will not see me until the time comes when you say, ‘Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord.’”

Worship Notes: Portions of the worship service has been adapted by Pastor Jen from the following resources: Clergy Stuff (Introduction, Absolution, Prayer of the Day, Prayers of Intercession, Offering prayer); Bible Worm/Rev. Terri Peterson (Preparing for worship, confession); Pastor Jen Boyd (Intro to confession, Invitation of stewardship)

Note(s) on Prayers of intercession: Linus Pauling, who is name in today's prayers, born on this day in 1901 was chemist and peace activist. He won the Nobel prize in chemistry as well as a Nobel Peace prize. He was among the founders of quantum chemistry and molecular biology. He spoke out against nuclear weapons as well as the Vietnam war, participating and founding various peace organizations.

Music Notes: Francis "Frank" Johnson (1792 –1844) was an American musician and prolific composer during the Antebellum period. African American composers were rare in the U.S. during this period, but Johnson was among the few who were successful. He was a performer and virtuoso of the (now rare) keyed Kent bugle and the violin. He wrote more than two hundred compositions of various styles Johnson was the first African American composer to have his works published as sheet music. He also was the first African American to give public concerts and the first to participate in racially integrated concerts in the United States. He led the first American musical ensemble to present concerts abroad, and he introduced the promenade concert style to America.

Franklin Delano Williams (1947 in Smithdale, Mississippi –1993 in Savannah, Georgia) was an American gospel music singer. As a child and during his early teens he joined the Southern Gospel Singers and later, The Williams Brothers. He teamed up with his brother Huey Williams in 1964, as part of The Jackson Southernaires. They won several awards during the 1980s. In 1979, while with the Jackson Southernaires, Williams formed The Mississippi Mass Choir while serving as director of Gospel promotions.
