DEVOTIONS

Think about devotions as a continuation of our community's worship. The following basic pattern could be one way of forming your household's devotions. Adapt as necessary!

GATHERING

♣ Light a candle to help you focus this time as "God time."

Prayer of the Week

God, you have given us the best news, that Jesus our Lord has risen from the dead. We praise you now and forever! Amen.

CARING CONVERSATION

Take a moment to check in with each other or to use the questions below.

- P Highs and Lows: What made you happy today? What made you unhappy?
- Thinking about This Week's Story: The female disciples were confused and terrified at the empty tomb, but this terror later turned to joy. What confused or scared you today? What gave you joy?
- Getting Ready for Next Week's Story: In next week's story, the disciples do not recognize Jesus, even though he is walking and talking with them. What is one thing that happened today that might be a "blessing in disguise"?

DAILY BIBLE READING

Read aloud from the DAILY BIBLE READING from the front. What do you want to remember from this reading?

PRAY TOGETHER

[⊕] God of the Ages, you continue to bless us, even when we fall short. (Have each person go around the circle and name one thing they've been blessed with over the last week.)

CLOSING


₱ If you used a candle, extinguish it as a sign of the end of the devotion time.
