Caring for God's Creation: A few years ago, we began efforts to be better stewards of God's creation particularly through Terracycle, the Clothing Shed and other recyclables. As we see the continuing changes in the climate, it becomes even more vital that we each step up our efforts individually as well as a congregation. We are re-starting our Creation Task Force to look at ways that we can continue to educate ourselves as well as take measures to care for all that is entrusted to us. There is a grassroots Lutheran group, Lutherans Restoring Creation (https://lutheransrestoringcreation.org/) that offers numerous resources as well as covenants. This is another part of what it means to share Christ's peace as we seek wholeness for God's world.
