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APOSTLES' CREED

PRAYERS OF INTERCESSION

Lord, we gather in your presence just as the multitudes did so many years ago on a hill in Galilee. We gather not only to hear your word to us but also to bring the joys and concerns of our lives to you.

Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Our spirit can be poor in so many ways. We lift up those who struggle with addiction, mental illness, physical illness, violence, oppression, and fear. Each of these tears apart what you have created, and the daily burden of carrying them attacks the very essence of who we are. We pray for freedom from these struggles – for us and for those known only to you. We claim your promise that we belong to you in this life and the life to come.

Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.

There are many things we mourn in this life: loss due to death, to aging; losses of jobs and relationships. These losses are very real and very difficult, and we find comfort knowing that you also wept and mourned loss in your life. We claim your promise of a peace that surpasses all understanding.

Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.

Lord, we don't desire to inherit the things of this earth but pray for humility and grace as we live our lives. Our inheritance comes through you, who overcame all the powers of earth and all creation so that we may be with you in both life and death. We claim your promise that we will share in your inheritance.

Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.

Jesus, you told us that when we seek first your kingdom and your righteousness, then the things we need will be provided. Help us to trust in your words, knowing that when we seek you – loving mercy, acting justly, walking humbly – you will provide. Give us the courage to stand up to injustice even when we are afraid. We claim your promise that one day, justice will roll down like the waters and righteousness like a stream.

Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy.

We pray, "forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." In teaching us this prayer, you also taught us how to be merciful. May we let go of our pride so that we may find reconciliation in our relationships. Help us to see those whom we see as "other" as our brother and sister, your beloved child: the homeless, the immigrant, the violent, the foreigner. We claim your promise of mercy as we are merciful to others.

Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God.

We know the human heart deceives itself, Lord, so how will any of us see you? Help us to lay down the pride, greed, envy, anger, and lust in our hearts. Refine our intentions and desires so that your will is our will. We claim your promise to make the blind see, so that we may see you.

Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.

Violence seems to rule the world. Whether in the streets of our towns, the mountains of Afghanistan, the deserts of Syria and Iraq, or the cities of Africa, we are killing each other. Lord, forgive us. We pray not only for the absence of conflict but for true peace — where weapons become instruments to tend crops and harvest trees and there shall be no more war. We claim your promise that people will come from the east and the west, the north and the south, to sit and eat together at your table.

Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Most of us do not know about persecution, especially for righteousness' sake. May we be aware of those who suffer and even die as they stand up for justice, liberation, peace, and basic human rights. As we gather so freely to worship you this morning, we pray safety for those who do so at the risk of prison or death. Shield them from danger as they boldly proclaim your word. Strengthen us so that we may be willing to stand up for that which we know is true. We claim your promise that your kingdom is greater than all the kingdoms of this world. Risen Lord, we are able to trust in your promises because you have defeated even death: Nothing can separate us from your love. As one and as your Body, we claim your promises to us as we choose to live as you lived.

Rejoice and be glad for God's kingdom is at hand





Music Notes:

Austin Cole Lovelace (1919-2010) was called by many the Dean of American Church music. Over many years he worked at a number of Methodist and Presbyterian churches in Colorado, North Carolina, Illinois, and Nebraska. He also worked at Union Theological Seminary in N.Y.C. and Garrett Theological Seminary in Evanston, Ill. He traveled widely as a Director of Music for general conferences, lecturer, and consultant. He was the organist for the Assembly of the World Council of Churches in 1954. He was a prolific writer and composer with over 700 compositions for church in print, as well as numerous articles and books on church hymnody. Dr. Lovelace was born in Rutherford Co., N.C. in 1919. He received his A.B. from High Point College in 1939, and his M.S.M. (1941) and D.S.M. (1950) from the School of Sacred Music, Union Theological Seminary, in New York City. He was a Fellow of the Hymn Society of America and a Past President as well.
