### **READING: EPHESIANS 6:10-20**

## Music Notes:

**Don Humphreys** was a sacred song composer from Morristown, New Jersey. There is a dearth of information on his career. He was a fairly prolific composer of solo vocal music in the mid-twentieth century, and was most productive between 1940 and 1971. His music was popular in Christian Science circles. Christian Science services always have a soloist rather than a choir.
