The Holy Gospel according to Matthew the 5th chapter. **Glory to you, O Lord.**

You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hidden. No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven.

'Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets; I have come not to abolish but to fulfil. For truly I tell you, until heaven and earth pass away, not one letter, not one stroke of a letter, will pass from the law until all is accomplished. Therefore, whoever breaks one of the least of these commandments, and teaches others to do the same, will be called least in the kingdom of heaven; but whoever does them and teaches them will be called great in the kingdom of heaven. For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.





and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.



Austin Cole Lovelace (1919-2010) who holds the Doctorate in Sacred Music from Union Seminary in New York City, was Minister of Music Emeritus of Wellshire Presbyterian Church, Denver, Colorado where he completed 52 years of active music ministry. He is the author of five books, served on the editorial committee for five hymnals, published over 800 works for organ, choir, and solo voice with 40 publishers. He has played organ recitals, conducted hymn festivals, choral and organ workshops, and choral festivals in 45 states as well as in Scotland, Sweden, Hungary, Fiji, and New Zealand. He holds the AAGO degree and was elected a Fellow in The Hymn Society in the United States and Canada after serving as president of the society.
