
Trinity Lutheran Church Brewster, Ny



MUSIC NOTES:

James Gardiner MacDermid (1875-1960) was a Canadian concert pianist and composer. He was born in Utica, Ontario and became an American citizen in 1906. He studied piano in London, Ontario and voice in Duluth, Minn He and his wife, Sybil Sammis, a concert soprano, gave recitals on tour from Chicago to Brooklyn, NY. Mr. MacDermid toured many parts of the nation and abroad as piano accompanist for his wife. He was best known as a composer of scriptural music. Mr. MacDermid came to New York in 1921 and joined the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers in 1922. He is best-known for his settings of Scripture and poems of Mary Baker Eddy for Christian Science services.
