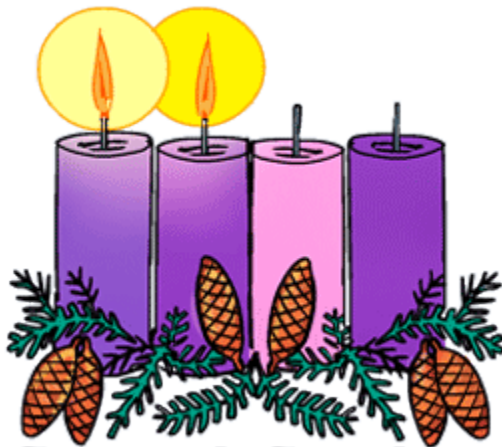

and give us courage to face our fear of feeling foolish

so that we can participate in your coming kingdom.

Forgive us for wanting to keep your promise to ourselves,

and bring us together with your people that together we might help each other through the shadowed valleys,

encourage one another up the mountainsides,

and recognize your glory revealed in a peaceful community we could never have imagined. Amen.

The promise is sure: Christ's advent is near, and in Christ we are forgiven all our sin. Know that you are a beloved child of God, and be strengthened in all goodness given through the grace of the Father, and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit. **Thanks be to God. Amen.**

Music Notes:

George Mursell Garrett (1834 – 1897) was an English organist and composer. Garrett was born in Winchester where his father was master of the choristers at Winchester Cathedral. He later served as assistant to Samuel Sebastian Wesley at Winchester. Garrett was appointed the Director of Music at St. John's College, Cambridge in 1857 and held the position for forty years. For many years, he served as organist at the Cathedral of Madras, India. Garrett wrote music for the Anglican Church in the form of service settings and anthems. He is perhaps best represented today by his Anglican chant setting of Psalm 126.
