CALL TO CONFESSION








PREFACE

but deliver us from evil.



Music Notes:

Pepper Choplin (born 1957) is a full-time composer, conductor and humorist. He has gained a reputation as one of the most creative writers in church music today. With a Bachelor of Music degree from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, he went on to earn a Master of Music degree in composition from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary. With a diverse musical background, Choplin incorporates varied styles such as folk, Gospel, classical, and jazz. His published works includes over 330 anthems for church and school choir plus 24 church cantatas and 4 books of piano arrangements. Over 150 groups have commissioned him to write original works for them. An original hymn, "Come to the Water" appears in the hymnal, Celebrating Grace. Each week, thousands of singers present his music in churches and schools in the United States and around the world.
