CALL TO WORSHIP & CONFESSION

We have come to worship God, the living God,

Who calls prophets and teachers to bear witness.





Quote on "Hallowed by your name"

"Throughout history Christians have agreed that, when we pray these words, we aren't really claiming that somehow we can add holiness to the name of God, but rather we affirm that our lives are to be modeled after divine holiness. As Scripture says, "Be holy, for I am holy" (Lev. 11: 24; 1 Pet. 1: 15–16; see also Matt. 5: 48). We see this already in one of the earliest writings to discuss the Lord's Prayer, Tertullian's already-quoted On Prayer. He affirms that . . . when we say, "Hallowed be Thy name," we pray this; that it may be hallowed in us who are in Him, as well in all others for whom the grace of God is still waiting; that we may obey this precept, too, in "praying for all," even for our personal enemies. And therefore with suspended utterance, not saying, "Hallowed be it in us, "we say, —"in all."

Music Note:

Sir Frederic Hymen Cowen (1852 –1935), was an English composer, conductor and pianist. Cowen was born Hymen Frederick Cohen at 90 Duke Street, Kingston, Jamaica, the fifth and last child of Frederick Augustus Cohen and Emily Cohen née Davis. His siblings were Elizabeth Rose Cohen (b. 1843); actress, Henrietta Sophia Cohen (b. 1845); painter, Lionel Jonas Cohen (b. 1847), and Emma Magnay Cohen (b. 1849). At the age of four years Frederic was brought to England, where his father became treasurer to the opera at Her Majesty's Opera, now Her Majesty's Theatre, and private secretary to William Humble Ward. Cowen studied under Moritz Hauptmann (harmony and counterpoint), Ignaz Moscheles (piano), Carl Reinecke (composition) and Ferdinand David (ensemble work). Cowen received honorary doctorates from Cambridge and Edinburgh in 1900 and 1910 respectively, and was knighted at St. James's Palace on 6 July 1911. Cowen married Frederica Gwendoline Richardson at St. Marylebone Registry Office, London, 23 June 1908. She was 30 years his junior and they had no issue. He died on 6 October 1935 and was buried at the Jewish Cemetery, Golders Green.
