William Bradshaw (1 September 1797, probably Virginia- 26 July 1861, Anderson County, Texas) was an American farmer and composer. He lived in east Tennessee, Lauderdale County, Alabama, and Anderson County, Texas and married Melinda Wear on 8 August 1818 in east Tennessee. He contributed nine tunes to *Supplement to the Kentucky Harmony* in 1820 and 1826.
