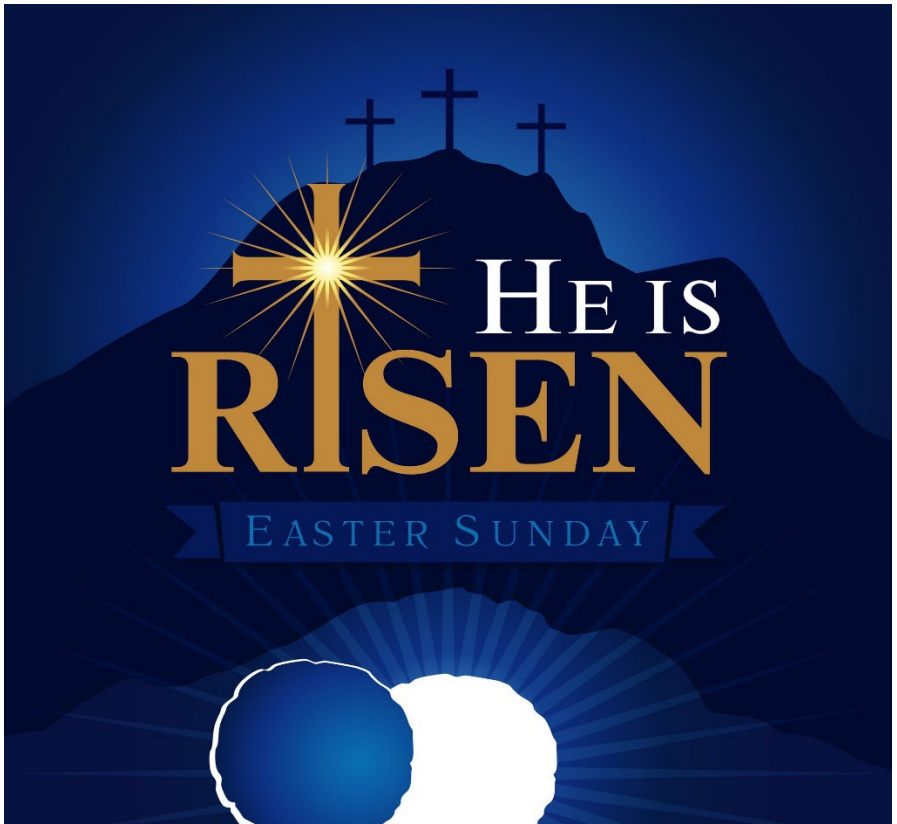

You who raised Christ from the dead promise healing and wholeness to all who suffer. Hold in your loving arms all who live diminished lives due to illness, injury, addiction, and all other afflictions. We pause to pray especially for those we name now, aloud or in our hearts.... (pause). We also lift up in prayer: **Bruce, Joan, Steve, Sara, Lucia, Nicole, Lois, Madeline, Peter, Carole, Vinnie, Willie and for those who have no one to name them and those who do not know Christ's name.**

Risen God, **Receive our prayer.**

We remember with sometimes heavy hearts those whom we have lost. Be with all who are missing loved ones this Easter. Comfort them with joyful memories and the promise of the resurrection. Risen God, **Receive our prayer.**

Pastor: These and the prayers of all creation we lift to you, trusting in your everlasting love and grace that shone forth from that empty tomb and in the risen life of Jesus the Christ. **Amen.**

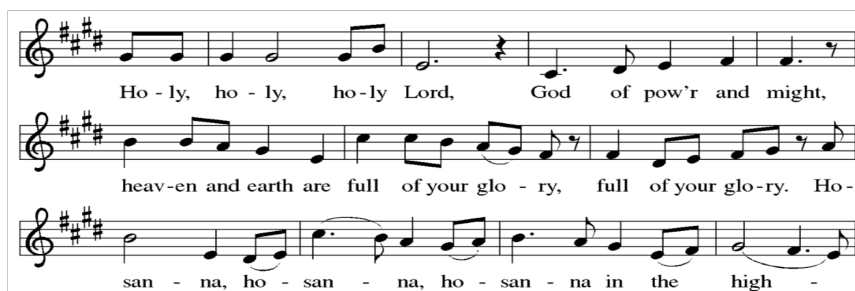

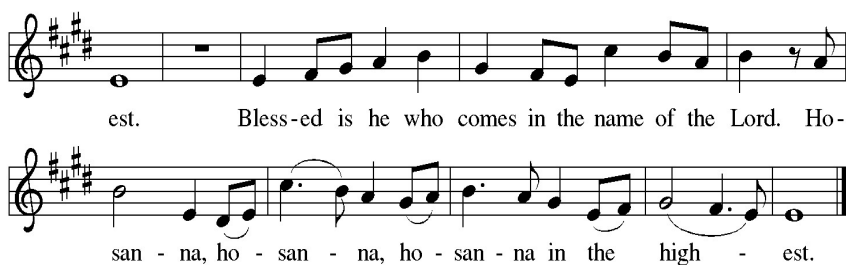

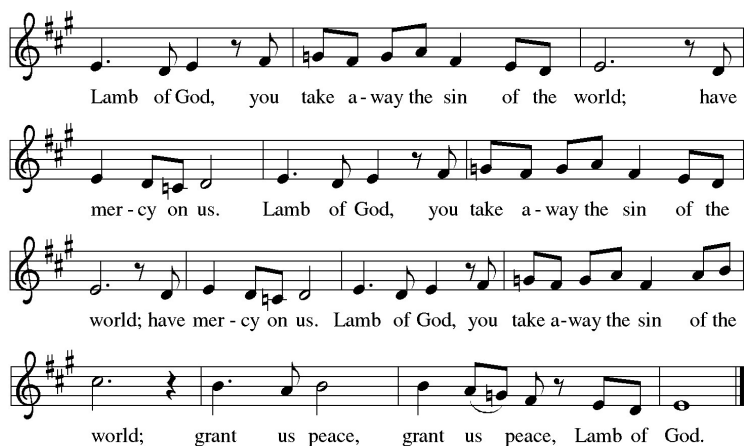
