Readings: Galatians 3:1-9, 23-29

You foolish Galatians! Who has bewitched you? It was before your eyes that Jesus Christ was publicly exhibited as crucified! The only thing I want to learn from you is this: Did you receive the Spirit by doing the works of the law or by believing what you heard? Are you so foolish? Having started with the Spirit, are you now ending with the flesh? Did you experience so much for nothing?—if it really was for nothing. Well then, does God supply you with the Spirit and work miracles among you by your doing the works of the law or by your believing what you heard?

Just as Abraham "believed God, and it was reckoned to him as righteousness," so, you see, those who believe are the descendants of Abraham. And the scripture, foreseeing that God would reckon as righteous the gentiles by faith, declared the gospel beforehand to Abraham, saying, "All the gentiles shall be blessed in you." For this reason, those who believe are blessed with Abraham who believed.

Now before faith came, we were imprisoned and guarded under the law until faith would be revealed. Therefore the law was our disciplinarian until Christ came, so that we might be reckoned as righteous-by faith. But now that faith has come, we are no longer subject to a disciplinarian, for in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith. As many of you as were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is no longer Jew or Greek; there is no longer slave or free; there is no longer male and female, for all of you are one in Christ Jesus. And if you belong to Christ, then you are Abraham's offspring, heirs according to the promise.

PRESENTATION

(Candidates for baptism, sponsors, and parents gather at the font.)

Pastor: God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of baptism. By water and the Word God delivers us from sin and death and raises us to new life in Jesus Christ. We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, and joined in God's mission for the life of the world.

Sponsors: We present Elijah Howard Witt.

Sponsors: We present Theo Rowan Witt.

(The minister addresses the parents.)

Called by the Holy Spirit, trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to have your child baptized into Christ?

Parents: We do.

As you bring your child to receive the gift of baptism, you are entrusted with responsibilities:

To live with him among God's faithful people, bring him to the word of God and the holy supper, teach him the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments;

place in his hands the holy scriptures, and nurture him in faith and prayer, so that he may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace.

Do you promise to help your child grow in the Christian faith and life?

Parents: We do.

(The minister addresses the sponsors.)

Sponsors, do you promise to nurture Theo in the Christian faith as you are empowered by God's Spirit, and to help him live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the church?

Sponsors: We do.

Sponsors, do you promise to nurture Elijah in the Christian faith as you are empowered by God's Spirit, and to help him live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the church?

Sponsors: We do.

(The minister addresses the assembly.)

People of God, do you promise to support Theo and Elijah and pray for them in their new life in Christ?

Assembly: We do.

At the river your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Holy Spirit. By the baptism of Jesus' death and resurrection you set us free from the power of sin and death and raise us up to live in you.

Pour out your Holy Spirit, the power of your living Word, that those who are washed in the waters of baptism may be given new life. To you be given honor and praise through Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever. **Amen.**

Sustain Theo and Elijah with the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever. **Amen.**

(The minister marks the sign of the cross on the forehead of the baptized and say:)

Theo, child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever. **Amen.**

Elijah, child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever. **Amen.**

O God, the giver of all life, look with kindness upon the fathers and mothers of these children. Let them ever rejoice in the gift that you have given them. Help them live as teachers and examples of your love and grace. Strengthen them in the covenant of their own baptism so they may continue to grow in the faith given to us through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

(A candle for the baptized is given to a sponsor as a representative of the congregation says:)

Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.

(The ministers and the baptismal group face the assembly.)

Let us welcome the newly baptized.

We welcome you into the body of Christ and into the mission we share: join us in giving thanks and praise to God and bearing God's creative and redeeming word to all the world.



Music Notes:

Delphine von Schauroth (1813-1887) was a German pianist and composer. She was born in Magdeburg, the daughter of Eduard Friedrich von Schauroth and his second wife Louise Teltz. She began piano studies at an early age with Friedrich Kalkbrenner in Paris, and in 1822 made her debut in Frankfurt am Main, followed by a European tour the next year, including appearances in Paris and London. When Felix Mendelssohn visited Munich in 1831, he considered marriage with Von Schauroth, and wrote to his sister Fanny that she had composed a passage of his Piano Concerto in G minor "that makes a startling effect." However, he never revealed what passage she had written. The concerto premiered in 1831 and Mendelssohn dedicated the work to her. In 1833, Von Schauroth married English clergyman Edwin Hill-Handley and moved to London, but continued her concert appearances. In 1870, Von Schauroth joined the General German Music Association as a composer. She died in Munich.

Della Florence *Wickersham* Byers (1874-1968) was born in Portland, Indiana. She was the last member of the Grand Junction "Gospel Trumpet family" and was the widow of the songwriter, Andrew L. Byers. Della Wickersham arrived at the Gospel Trumpet offices in Grand Junction, Mich., to accept work, without salary, with the small but dedicated group responsible for the publication of Church of God literature. In 1874, at the age of twelve, she was converted during a revival meeting in her home. The services were conducted by D. S. Warner. It was at this time that her father, H. C. Wickersham, accepted the teaching on the unity of God's people and the concept of the church which Warner was holding. Later that year, young Della was baptized. She and her six children moved to Sacramento, CA after her husband passed away.
